As mentioned in the previous Annual Report, an offer had been received to sponsor half the cost of a double ski for the Club. This option was accepted during the year, and our thanks to Parnell, Kell and Foster, Chartered Accountants of Sydney for this sponsorship. The remainder of the cost for the ski was raised by the Social Committee.

Other competitive equipment acquired during the season through sponsorship by members included two single skis.

A \$10,000.00 grant from the State Government was expended on the new building during the year. This grant was mainly used to pay for the floor - parquetry on the dance floor and tiles at the eastern end, plus plumbing, hardware, paint and other miscellaneous items.

As mentioned earlier a further \$5,000.00 grant has been obtained and with a similar amount from Wollongong City Council, an awning will be provided over the stairway.

The Club was fortunate in receiving a \$ for \$ grant of \$515.50 from the Australian Government being half cost of a replacement motor for the I.R.B. During the year, a second I.R.B. motor was acquired with funds raised by the Social Committee, plus a donation from the Helensburgh Lions Club.

A \$200.00 subsidy towards the operating cost of the I.R.B. was sought and approved during the 1985/86 season, but because of an administrative oversight within the Illawarra Branch, the papers were not processed, and the subsidy not paid. Following representations by the Club Executive, the Branch agreed to meet the cost of the subsidy.

A further \$200.00 subsidy for the operation of the I.R.B. during the current season, has also been received.

Our thanks and appreciation is extended to the Australian Government for its support of surf life saving in general and so far as Helensburgh Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. is concerned, we have received direct benefits for the \$ for \$ gear grant and the I.R.B. Fuel subsidy.

The N.S.W. State Government has also supported our Club with a grant of \$10,000.00 (approved last year), and \$5,000.00 this season.

Our thanks is extended to the Wollongong City Council, initially for the help given in completing the club house prior to the official opening, for the assistance with the official opening, and for the commitment of a \$5,000.00 grant to match the State Government grant.

The Lotto Club being run by Bobo White continued through the early part of the season, and was disbanded during March 1987. Funds raised through the Lotto Club were used towards a subsidy to the competitors travelling to the Australian Championships in Western Australia.

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed this season under patrol captains Mark Wallace, Phil Doran, Gary George, Tony Van Zyl, Paul Potter, Chris Emmett, Mark Thompson, Mark Ryan and Graham Cook.

There were 75 active members rostered for patrols.

There were no serious incidents recorded during the season. A total of 33 rescues were made, 5 with the I.R.B. Approximately 700 people were warned to swim within the patrolled area, or were guided to more safe swimming areas.

10 incidents of marine stings (blue bottles) were recorded as well as 14 other cases of first aid.

In accordance with Association rules, active patrol members are required to complete a Proficiency Test each season; 12 active members failed to present themselves for the Proficiency Test this season.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

At the commencement of the season, club life saving and competitive equipment was presented for inspection to Branch officials in a very high standard. All equipment has since been maintained to a high standard, with repairs being effected as required throughout the season.

At the close of the season, the I.R.B. radio was not operable despite it being repaired twice throughout the year Repairs were also required to the ambu-manikins to bring them to a satisfactory state

Two new I.R.B. motors were acquired during the season. Other new equipment includes a fuel tank for the I.R.B., a double ski and two single skis. A rescue board was obtained partly with prize money won in the Egg Corporation Competition. as well as a new Shock Pack. partly with prize money won in the B.H.P. Patrol Competition

The Jack Mawson Memorial First Aid Room has been well maintained throughout the season, and has been well stocked with first aid supplies

1.R.B. CAPTAINS REPORT

During the season, two new motors were acquired for the I.R.B. one a replacement, and the second provided through fund raising. Other major items included a new fuel tank (donated by the Video Bug, Helensburgh), and a second prop guard.

Expenditure on the I.R.B. this season in repairs, maintenance and operating costs (fuel) totalled more than \$1200.00. With the exception of \$200.00 operational subsidy from the Australian Government, all costs were met by general club funds. Although the I.R.B. is one of the most expensive pieces of life saving equipment to obtain initially, and to operate, its value in life saving cannot be counted in dollars and cents.

I would particularly like to express my thanks to Paul Potter for his expertise in helping maintain the duck; also to Graham Cook.

Again this season, we have had an active I.R.B. competitive team and whilst we achieved success in winning all events at the North Wollongong carnival, our efforts at the Branch Championships resulted in only three 3rd placings. We have however qualified in seven of the eight events for the State Championships.

I would like to see more members gain I.R.B. awards next season so that our Club has not only one I.R.B. driver in each patrol, but two. I hope you will give it a go.

CARNIVALS AND COMPETITION

The club was poorly represented at carnivals last season, except for a handful of regular craft competitors, a few cadets and three officials who kept the club colours flying.

Damien Coke was a good example of lining up every week along with cadet Scott Boyle, who next season joins the junior ski riders. I expect him to do quite well.

Second year Junior Steven McDonald should be ready to show out in sprints and flag events. The future strength of our club lies in our Cadets and Juniors.

Last season, the ski riders competed in all events with a great deal of success and at times winning all the ski races on the programme. At the Branch Championships, the club won four of the six ski events and were placed 2nd in the other two. In all the club recorded 5 Gold, 3 Silver and 2 Bronze on the day.

A Silver medal went to John Boyle and Brian Morton in the Junior Double Ski event and the N.S.W. Championships.

The Australian Championships were held at Scarborough beach, Western Australia. Helensburgh Stanwell Park was represented by six competitors, one team manager and one official. Our club was credited with two 4th placings and a 6th placing in the finals. They were John Boyle and Brian Morton in the Junior Double Ski (4th), Brett Daintry 4th in the Open Board Riding, and Brian Morton 6th in the Junior Single Ski. After a good season, I think the boys were deserving of better things when the State and Australian came along. But I am sure they will make amends this coming season.

Brian Morton had four wins and a 2nd at the Branch Championships inlouding a win in the Open Single Ski, a first time for a Junior in this event. Brian had a top season at surf carnivals winning 17 Single Ski races including 5 in the Open category. He represented Illawarra in the Under 18 Branch Team winning the Single Ski race, he was also named Man of the Carnival on three occasions throughout the year. A muscular back injury, however, prevented Brian from paddling at his best in the State and Australian Champions, but nevertheless he finished 7th in the State and 6th in the Australian. He also gained 1st placing in the Stillwater Championships conducted at Lake Illawarra.

John Boyle, one of our strongest competitors, paddled very well at the Branch Championships collecting two Gold and a Bronze. He also won many Open and Junior ski events. John represented Illawarra on two occasions, first in the Open Inter-Branch Championships, and later in the Under 18 Inter-city team. He was awarded Man of the Carnival at Towradgi and Stanwell Park carnivals for outstanding wins on the day.

John once again teamed with Brian on the Club's new double ski, which was sponsored by Parnell Kerr and Foster, Chartered Accountants of Sydney, with the balance being raised by the Social Committee through raffles at the Helensburgh Workmens Club. They had a great deal of success winning ten Open Double Ski and three Junior Double Ski races. They were rarely unplaced. After winning the Branch Double Ski event, they started favourite at the State. The pair paddled well clear of the field, but were caught from behind right on the line and had to be content with 2nd place. Misfortune struck once again in the final of the Australian when they were in a close 2nd place, but were interferred with at the first can and lost some 20 metres. Paddling hard they managed to regain 2nd place only to be placed 4th in a blanket finish on the line.

Meikle Watts competed at the Branch for a 3rd in the Ladies Malibu

Brett Daintry gained a 3rd placing at the Branch Open Board Riding, and for the second year in succession, was placed 4th in the Australian. A welcome change of luck, and a few good waves could make the difference for Brett.

Congratultions to James and Jason Powell for their win in the Junior First Aid Competition at the Branch Championships, a first for Stanwell Park. Jason and James also competed at the N.S.W. titles in this event. Keep up the good work.

Chris McKay performed well in the Junior Board Riding, to gain 3rd place in the Branch Champion-ships, and later in the Ski races, gained a Gold in the Junior Ski Relay. He then teamed with Kevin Morton to gain 2nd place in the Open Double Ski.

No wins were recorded this year in beach events at the Branch, but some good efforts were recorded. The most outstanding competitor on the day was Don Burke who finished 4th in the Flags, 5th in the Open Sprint and teamed with Mark Thompson, Peter Burke and Gary Rankin to run 4th in the Open Beach Relay. Mark Thompson also did well for 5th placing in the Open Flags and 8th in the Sprint.

Cadet Scott Boyle was placed 4th in the final of the flags, and had many placings in beach events at carnivals.

Our top beach competitor Ron Burke was unable to compete owing to a shoulder injury; hoping he is fully recovered for the coming season.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE REPORT

The Club's Social Committee has experienced a tremendously successful season. Raffles conducted at the Helensburgh Workmens Club have yielded almost \$2,000.00 profit, which has been used mainly towards new equipment.

It is extremely pleasing to be able to report that this Committee achieved its major goal of purchasing an additional I.R.B. motor from funds raised.

The Committee was also able to provide funds to match a sponsorship obtained for the purchase of a double ski for competition.

Many well attended functions which are listed below, were organised by the Social Committee this year, including the celebrations for the opening of the new club house, the Stanwell Park surf carnival, party nights and competitors fund raising functions. All of these earnt our club much needed revenue.

Committees

This season saw the election and establishment of an active Social Committee. The first part of the season saw the Committee principally involved in fund raising activities, but in recent times its activities have been more towards injecting new thoughts into social activities for the club.

The Social Committee has teamed up with the newly formed group of ladies and both have worked hard towards ensuring the best possible social functions.

A special mention of thanks to the organisers of both groups - Don Harris and Irene Dezius, and their helpers.

The Finance Committee met only on one occasion this season, and submitted recommendations to the Committee in regard to increases in Club fees and other charges

The House Committee also met only once this season, and submitted a number of recommendations regarding the future use of the club house, including hiring out for social functions.

The Building Committee met regularly during July, August and September 1986, to monitor progress of work on the new building.

The Seagulls is now operating as a section of the Club, although for convenience it is basically run as a separate entity. Club Rules and Association requirements provide that the Seagulls be governed by and be subject to the Rules of the Helensburgh Stanwell Park S.L.S.C.

The Seagulls committee has maintained a high profile within the Club generally and many of the office bearers are actively involved in most functions and activities. Fund raising activities are shared between the main Club and the Seagulls with the Seagulls continuing to raise all funds necessary to continue their activities, on their own.

The Seagulls Annual Report and Financial Statements are included at the rear of this report.

Carnivals and Competition

During the season, some difficulty arose in interpreting the rules governing entry to club competition, and it will be necessary for the rules concerned, to be examined and amended as required before the start of the 1987/88 club competitions.

As mentioned by the Team Manager in his report, attendance at carnivals this season has been very poor. Carnival entry fees to the extent of \$368.90 (excluding IRB competition) were incurred this season, and of this amount \$108.30 (30%) was paid for entry to events that were not contested, i.e. the competitor did not compete in the event, or did not even turn up for the carnival. Naturally this situation cannot be allowed to continue and it was decided by the Committee at its March meeting that the problem be resolved before the next season, with competitors only being nominated for carnivals under certain conditions.

At this stage, I would express my personal thanks to Lance and Barbara Morton for their continuing assistance again this year, in compiling carnival entries.

Security of the Club house and Club equipment

With the opening of the new building, and the installation of a new security key system by Council, extensive efforts have ben made to restrict the number of Club members who have direct access to the club house. However, on many occasions, the caretakers and other club officers have reported that the club house is 'wide open.' This leaves valuable club equipment vulnerable to theft and/or damage and cannot be allowed to continue.

Publicity and Public Relations

Special attention has been given to promoting the Surf Club throughout the season. A general invitation was extended to all local residents to the official opening of the new building, and club functions are being advertised as 'All Welcome.'

A Surf Club team has been entered in the Helensburgh Touch Football competitions.

Publicity this season has generally been through articles in the Northern News. However, some concern has been expressed that items about our Club were not as frequent, did not include photographs, and were not as detailed as reports from other surf clubs. The Club Executive intends to introduce a number of changes in conjunction with the Publicity Officer next season

During the season, Tanya Potter accepted the task of collecting and maintaining a photographic record of the Club and its members.

Attempts were made to introduce a regular monthly newsletter for distribution amongst patrol members. Unfortunately lack of time and an editor has temporarily prevented the newsletter from continuing.

Helensburgh Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. was again affiliated with the Illawarra Branch of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia; the Seagulls were also affiliated with the Illawarra Branch Junior Association.

Drowning, 1/2/86

As reported in the previous Annual Report, a male person drowned in the surf at Stanwell Park beach on 1/2/86.

It was not until the latter part of 1986 that the Club Executive learnt the Coroner had dispensed with an inquest into the incident, and had formally recorded death by drowning. Subsequent to that, meetings involving the Club Executive and all members who were either on patrol or at the beach on that day, were convened to generally discuss the incident and ensure that the actions of the patrol were satisfactory.

In an endeavour to finally close this unfortunate incident, a letter was forwarded to the Illawarra Branch in March 1987 setting out the Club's version of the incident, including quotes from statements made by various people and tendered to the Coroner, and suggesting that in similar circumstances whether it be with our Club or any other Club, a Branch officer should be delegated to liaise with the Club Executive and provide guidance on such aspects as recording of facts, representation at the inquest, police involvement, public liability risks, etc.

Inventory of Club Equipment

Now that the Club building is completed and better security is available, the Club Executive intend to compile a complete list of all club equipment, including life saving, competition, training, and general items. It is intended this be included as a part of future Annual Reports.

THE NEW CLUB HOUSE

In the 12 weeks before the new building was officially opened, many members gave freely of their personal time to complete the various small jobs still required. In that period, the Building Committee met regularly every two weeks, to ensure that no delays occurred in meeting a fairly tight schedule.

The major problem was co-ordinating work so as one job did not interfere with other work, such as completing all the painting before the parquetry was laid. Even in the last week, work was programmed, with the final activity being the erection of the plaques bearing the names of almost 200 donors who had assisted financially.

The official opening ceremony took place before a crowd estimated conservatively at 450. Club President, Terry Daintry briefly outlined the history of the project, and expressed appreciation for the assistance both financially and in kind that the Club had received.

Lord Mayor, Ald. Frank Arkell praised the Club and its members for their perserverance and efforts in completing the building, and the local community for its support of the Club, before declaring the building officially opened.

In addition to the above, there were many Club members who worked on the project. Completion was only achieved through the efforts of these members who in addition to their traditional role of lifesaving, gave up more of their time to become carpenters, painters, cleaners, etc. and to these members, a special vote of thanks is recorded.

The total cost of the building up to the time of opening was \$238,500. This was funded as follows:

A few minor tasks still remain to fully complete the building, such as minor plumbing work, erection of shelves, improvements to the public address system, additional power points, lighting, etc. These are being carried out as opprtunity arises.

Two major items still remain to be completed, viz to erect an awning over the stairway leading to the 1st floor level and balcony, and to replace the existing security grill and gate adjacent to the first aid room. Funds for the awning have been made available by way of a \$5,000.00 grant from the State Government (Department of Sport and Recreation) matched with a further \$5,000.00 grant from the Wollongong City Council. It is expected that the work on the awning will be commenced early in the new season.
