I submit herewith for your consideration and adoption the 81st Annual Report of the Helensburgh - Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club, covering our activities during the 1987/88 season.

Our Club reached a further milestone during the year, the achievement of 80 years of community service. It is fitting at this time to reflect on how milestones in our history have been reached, and in every case from the formation of the Club in 1908 to the patrolling of the beach 80 years later, there is one common factor - the commitment of individual members who give so freely of their time.

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Because of the reduced number of active members, only eight patrols were formed this year. Patrol Captains were Jeff Lucke, Mark Ryan, Mark Thompson, Phil Doran, Kevin Morton, Mark Wallace, Gary George and Chris Emmett. There were 54 active members rostered for patrols.

In accordance with Association rules, active patrol members are required to complete a Proficiency Test each season; 9 members failed to present themselves for the Proficiency Test this season and were accordingly rostered for radio or observation duties.

42 rescues were recorded during the season, 8 with the I.R.B. Almost 400 people were warned or directed to swim within the patrolled area.

16 cases of first aid were recorded.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

At the commencement of the season, all life saving equipment was presented for inspection by Branch officials in a high standard. During the season all equipment has been maintained to a similar high standard.

The I.R.B was overhauled at the start of the season, and the two motors serviced during the year. The I.R.B was damaged during the Branch Championships in May, whilst being used by another club, and is currently undergoing repairs.

New patrol screens have been provided, by way of donation from the Centennial Hotel, Helensburgh. Competitive equipment has been maintained in a satisfactory condition, with boards and skis being attended to as required by Lance Morton.

Consideration was given during the year to the future of the oared suft boat 'Con Asmussen'. The boat has not been used for a number of years in competition, and several suggestions have been made to place the boat on display in the surf club (hanging from the ceiling). It is proposed this matter will be discussed at a Special General Meeting to be held in October 1988.

A new UHF portable radio was obtained during the year at a cost of \$1200.00 financed on an Australian Government \$ for \$ grant. The two oxy-vivas are currently being converted to air bag operation as required by the Association.

The Jack Mawson Memorial First Aid Room continues to be well maintained by John Walker.

I.R.B. CAPTAINS REPORT

The past season has been a quiet one, but an eventful one in different ways. Firstly we had one of the "slackest" seasons in gaining I.R.B. awards, with only one drivers award gained.

On the other side, this is the first season the Club has been able to operate the I.R.B. with two motors - we now have a fully serviceable stand-by motor. I wish to thank the Social Committee for raising the funds to acquire the second motor, so that during the past season, there was always another motor to rely on if one failed.

On the competitive side, I would like to thank all the competitions (drivers, crewpersons and patients), for their efforts in I.R.B. competition.

I believe the Helensburgh-Stanwell park club initiated I.R.B. competition in the Illawarra Branch. Records will show that the Club's I.R.B. competitors have competed in some of the biggest sea conditions since inception of State competitions. During these years of competition, the Club members have shown that they can compete with the best of them. That includes the big budget clubs and clubs that can call on many resources.

I.R.B. competition provides another avenue for members to be competitive in surf life saving and I hope that the Helensburgh-Stanwell park Club will continue to have proficient and active drivers on the beach at all times.

CARNIVALS AND COMPETITION

Andrew Bedwell also represented Illawarra in the Inter-city carnival and performed well in beach events. Andrew finished 2nd in both Sprint and Flags at the Branch Championships, a good effort.

In the Branch Board Riding Championships, Rohan White gained a well earned silver medal. Rohan is a keen surfer and is due for a big season in 1989. Brett Daintry also competed well but met with no luck in the final.

Jason and James Powell did well in the First Aid Championships at Branch level to take out 3rd place. Janine Powell will swim in the under 15's next season and I am sure she will have a paddle on the board as well.

After losing some of our champion ski riders to other clubs, we were left with only one ski competitor, Kevin Morton. Although out of action at the early part of the season he managed to win a race, was placed on several occasions and made the semi-finals at the NSW State Championships.

Lets hope the Club can encourage more young competitors to compete next season.

The Club's caretakers have again expressed concern at the general attitude of members of leaving the Club house, boat shed, etc., wide open. This is obviously a matter which must be corrected quickly and has been referred to the House Committee for attention.


