

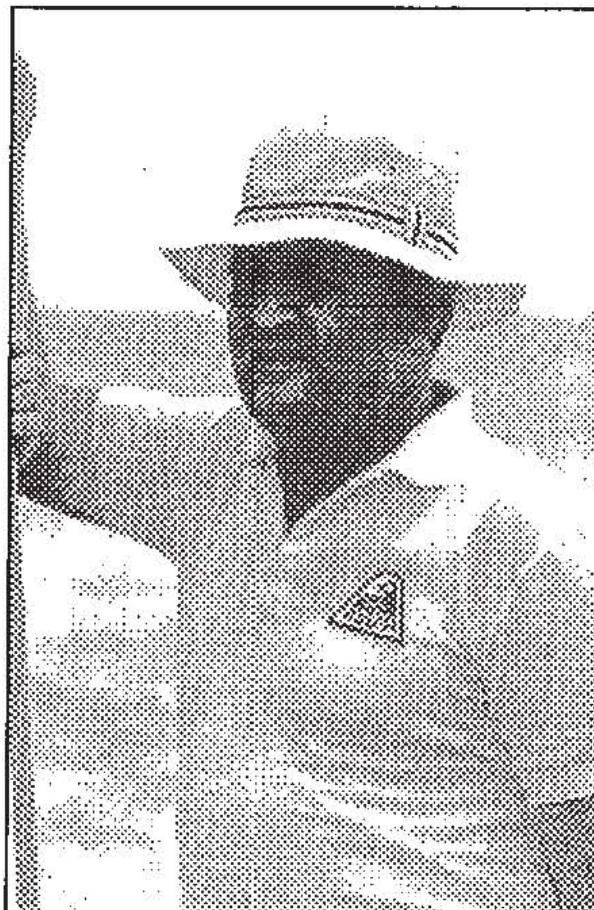

Presidents Report

What a sensational year, a year I think every member should be proud of. As a Surf Life Saving Club, the very fibre of our Club, Patrolling members, were again reliable and of a high standard. Our Patrolling members take pride in their uniform, they take great pride in the knowledge of our Clubs past achievements and I thank every one of them for invaluable service.

Our fundraising feats for this season have been incredible to say the least and many records have been broken. Assurance Day (Collection Day) was a record amount of \$ 5300.

Thanks to Peter McDonald and especially Jack McMillan, the annual Car Raffle raised \$ 3123, another record.

Anzac Day "Two-up" was again ran by our members at the Helensburgh Workmens Club, raising \$ 1000, another record.

A fundraiser for our Club competitors and to send Simon Harris to the World Titles raised \$8700. A fundraiser of the likes that had never in my memory happened before.

Our Club Boat Captain, Don Burke, as good as single handedly raised \$ 7066 towards funding the Boaties expenditure during the season. His tenacity and passion was rewarded with him winning the Club Person of the Year. And let me say that if every Club had one or two Don Burkes, they would never lose spirit or funds.

A big thank you must go to the Helensburgh Workmens Club (HWC), for their very generous donation of approx. \$5300 towards the purchase of an IRB (of which half was paid by BP with their National Sponsorship) and two Ambi-Manukins for training.

One donation that must be mentioned entirely separate to anything else, is the personal donation made by our patron Marjorie (Midge) Palmer. We approached the HWC with an application for funding and unfortunately the HWC, due to reforms in their sponsorship criteria, could not reach our required amount. At that stage Midge took it upon herself to donate the remaining amount, totaling \$2100 to purchase various equipment. For one member of the community to donate that amount of money from their own pocket is something I can not find the words to show our Clubs appreciation. You are truly a priceless asset to our community.

One day that I will remember for a long time was the Inaugural Ocean Swim from Coalcliff to Stanwell Park. It has been the dream of a few members for a number of years. To see this event come to fruition, to have 187 competitors and to make a profit in the first year was an absolutely remarkable success. A huge thank you goes to Mat White for his vision and

to Murray Dowling, Wayne Johnston, Kevin Keane and Andrew Perrin for the masses of time they all contributed to the success of the day.

When it comes to competition, I must admit it was a very rewarding year. With our Beach competitors training together at the ovals, both the Boat Crews really generating a good clean competitive nature between them, success was just a matter of time. Both Junior Boat Crews, against the odds, competed at a level that was never expected of them and I believe that they have now become a very bright future for our Club, both in their own success and the development of future crews.

On the Beach Simon Harris was still our standout competitor, with silver at State and Aussies and bronze at the Worlds in Beach Flags. But some competitors really came from nowhere... Michael Astill Branch Open Sprint Champion, Paul Astill Branch U/19 Sprint Champion, Luke McCarthy Branch U/19 Flags Champion, James Potter Branch Open Flags Champion and the one that really invigorated everyone, including Con Assmussen in the grand stand, Simon Cooks 3rd in the U/16 Mens Flags at the Australian Titles.

Two young competitors who stood out at the Aussie Titles also were our young female competitors. Firstly Laura Humphries followed some good results during the year with semi final births in both the U/16 Sprint and Flags. Laura improves every year and her results are a credit to her hard work and training. Our other female competitor at the Titles, Allira Mercer, who was a late inclusion at the Titles performed admirably against girls who were much stronger and almost 2 years her senior. She ran some remarkable races to get as far as the semi finals and she looks to have a very bright future.

At an administration level, I believe the Club is in a very sound state, which is reflected by the amount of activities taking place and the success being obtained in many areas. It has been the aim of the Executive to encourage and support those members and Committees who were willing to give off their time to promote the Club, competition and Surf Life Saving in general.

Next year will be our 95th Anniversary, a fantastic milestone and a time for great celebration. There will be a number of functions run by the Club and we will again host the Branch Championships.

So in conclusion, let me thank our Executive members for their time and efforts and to all members Patrolling or social who make this Club a joy to be President of.

My greatest thank you goes to my wife Louise, for supporting me along the way when times family life has been somewhat hectic, and the "Surf Club" has become a swear word. Louise has always supported me and I thank me darling wife for that.

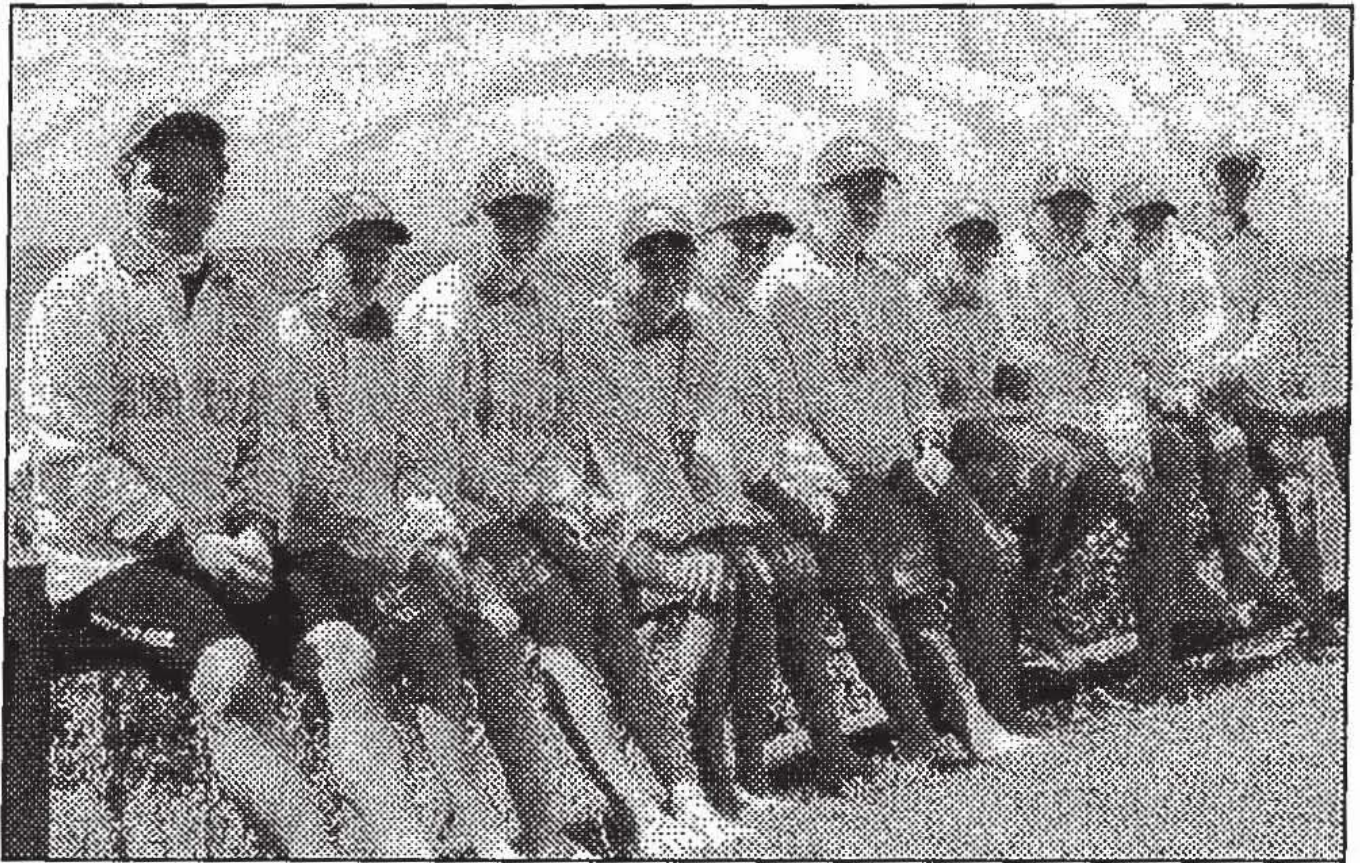

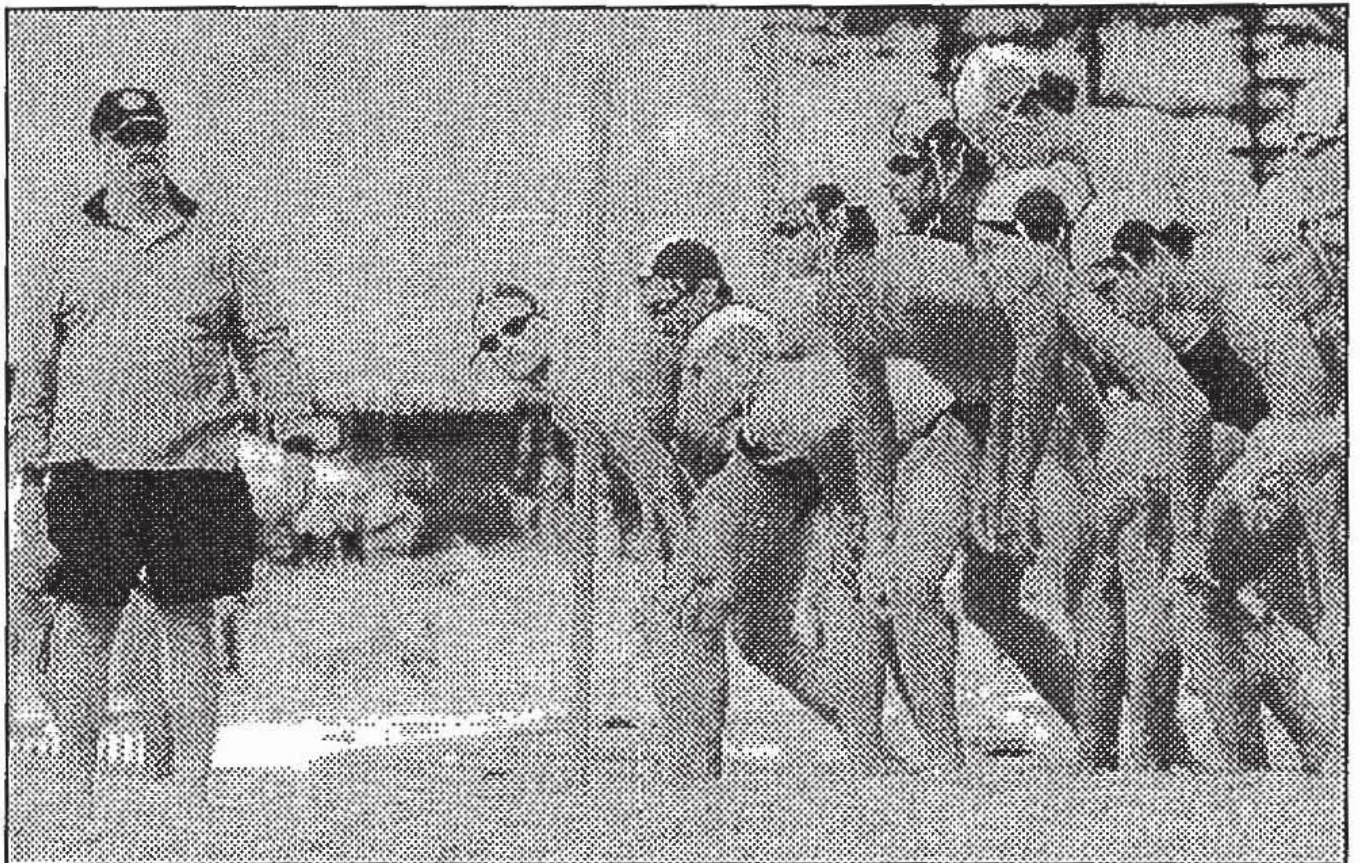

Open Surf Swim Branch Championships

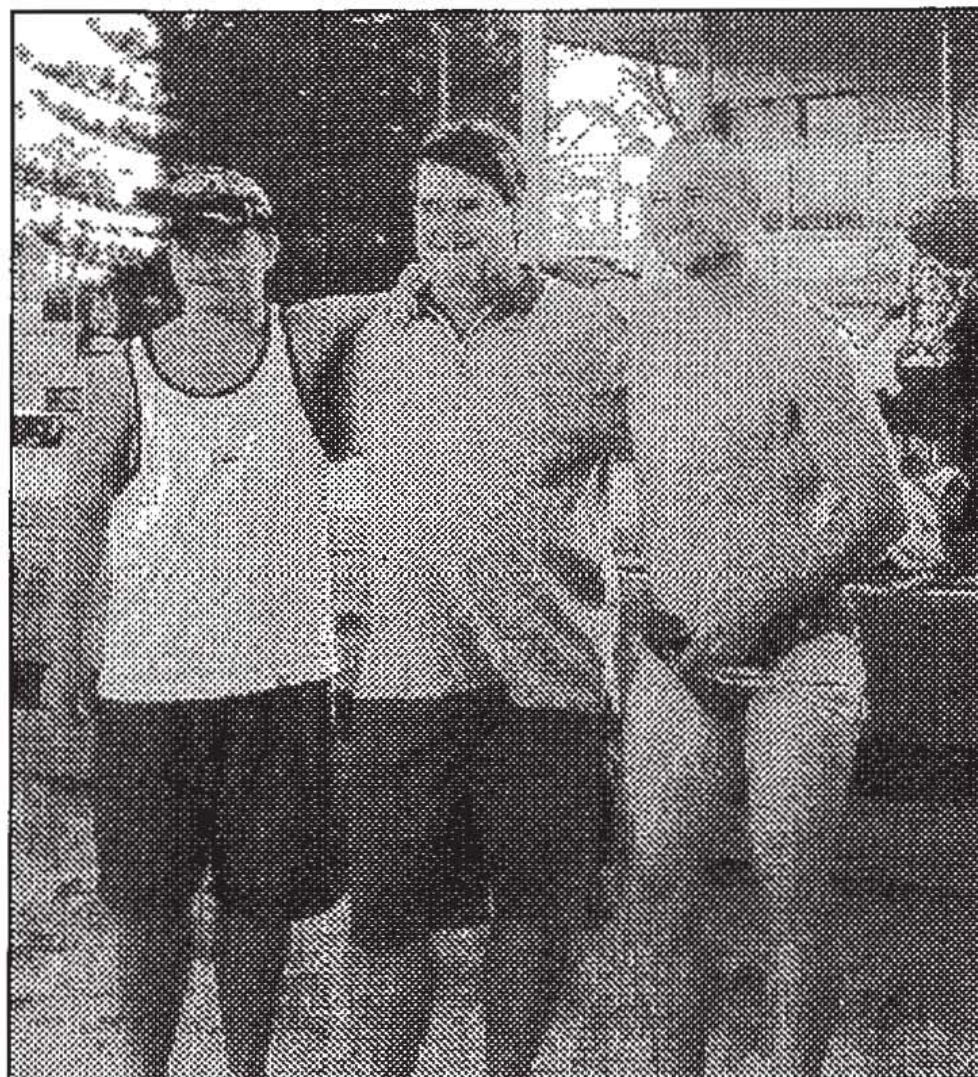




New Bronze Squad

First Day on Patrol



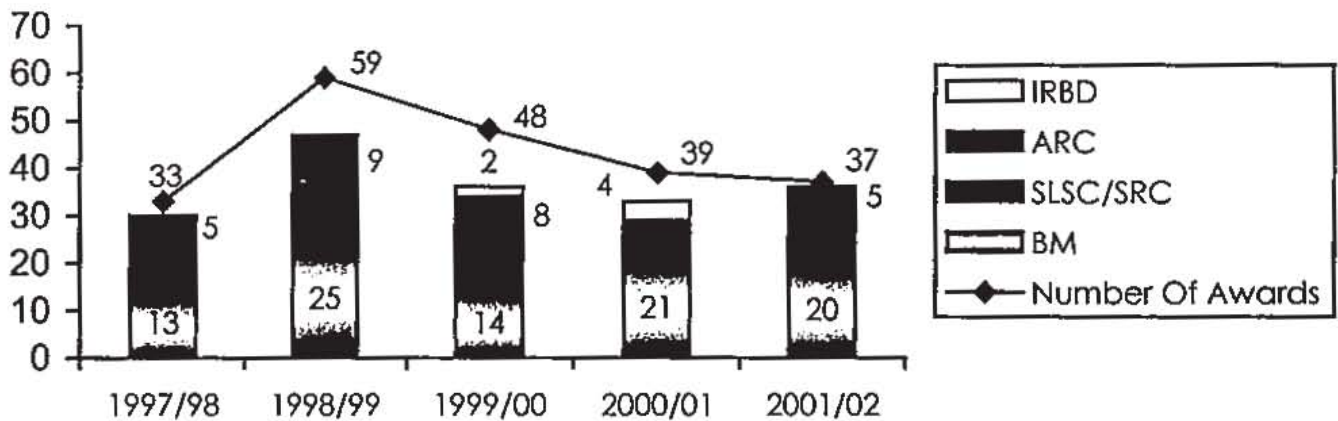

Chief Instructors Report

Training and Awards

This season saw a further drop off in the number of awards gained by club, despite this drop the core awards Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate remain strong ensuring good patrol strength for future seasons. It was also pleasing to see members gain their Advance Resuscitation Certificate.

There were no changes to the Training Manual this season and the promised new IRB Training Manual was released, unfortunately the club was unable to train any new drivers.



Bronze Medallion

A great group of members gained their Bronze Medallions this season with a mixture of old and new members. 10 of the members gaining their BM joined the club for the first time this season and 2 rejoined the club after a long absence from the club (previous junior members.)

Along with the traditional Run-Swim-Run, members were trained in Resuscitation, First Aid, Signals, Surf Skills, Patrols, IRB Crewing, Rescue Techniques and Emergency Care.

This season the training was spread among 3 squads headed up by Bobo White and Mark Wallace, Jeff Lucke, Daryl Turnbull and Peter O'Halloran, and myself with assistance from Peter Turner and Evan Griffiths. These Training Officers spent many weekday afternoons and Sunday mornings putting the squads through their paces. It is a huge team effort on behalf of the club.

Surf Rescue Certificate

This season saw 11 junior members make their first step towards becoming a lifesaver this season.

The members trained in the Run-Swim-Run, Resuscitation, Basic First Aid, Signals, Patrols, Surf Skills and Rescue Techniques.

Peter McDonald and Geoff Ryder once again put in a big effort educating and introducing our new young lifesavers to surf life saving.

Advanced Resuscitation Certificate

5 members gained their ARC this season. Two of the members being new to the club and having only gained their Bronze Medallion earlier in the season. This is a good result for the club, these being the first for 2 seasons. Club members should see the ARC as the next logical step in their surf life saving career from gaining their BM.

The ARC training included various resuscitation techniques, using the Air Bag Oxygen Resuscitator, fitting Stiffneck Collars and patient management. Training was enhanced by the addition of 2 new training aids; an adult sized ResusiAnne and a baby sized ResusiBaby both with a Skillmeter. The Skillmeter measures depth of compression, hand positions and that the correct breaths are being blown.

Next season will see the introduction of the "Oropharyngeal Airway " into the award, which will require all members with their ARC to be re-trained to update their skills.

Peter McDonald and myself ran the training over a 5-week period with a 100% success rate.

Proficiency Tests

The club organized 2 days for Proficiency Tests this season combining Surf Rescue, Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation and IRB Drivers. This format has worked well over the past couple of season and proved successful once again. The club had large numbers turnout on both days.

By the end of the season the club had the following numbers proficient in each award,

Surf Rescue Certificate	11
Bronze Medallion	101
Advanced Resuscitation Certificate	31
IRB Drivers	19

Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate holders proficiency test included run-swim-run, rescue using rescue tube and rescue board, IRB rescue (BM only), one and two person resuscitation, signals, surf awareness and a patrol scenario.

ARC holders were tested on all facets of resuscitation including use of the Air Bag Oxygen Resuscitator and any new techniques introduced since their last proficiency.

IRB drivers were tested in conjunction with the IRB rescues for the Bronze Medallion proficiency giving the club drivers experience with a large number of crewpersons during the test.

The mass Proficiency Test's being held by the club ensure a maximum number of members become proficient each season and reduces the number of days members need to attend the beach for the annual proficiency tests.

Next season our main focus will be on the ARC as the "Oropharyngeal Airway" is being included in the award and all of the clubs ARC holders will need to become proficient in the use of the airway.

Thank you to the many club examiners and instructor who lent a hand conducting the proficiency tests during this season.

Conclusion

Thank you to all members whole played a part in fellow members gaining an award or becoming proficient. A big thankyou to Evan Griffiths for his continued availability as an examiner and for his guiding hand, to Jeff Lucke the club's District Supervisor who trained a Bronze Medallion Squad and oversaw all the exams conducted by the club. Also thanks to Peter McDonald, Peter O'Halloran, Peter Turner, Bobo White, Geoff Ryder, Daryl Turnbull for their continuing support as the clubs group of active instructors, without these members our club would be struggling to train new Bronze Medallions and Surf Rescue Certificates.

A final congratulations to all of the clubs new award holders, thankyou for putting in the time to attend training and go through the pain (for some) to gain an award and help increase our clubs patrolling strength.

Team Captains Report

The 2001-2002 season was a very successful season even though there was limited number of local carnivals for our beach and surf competitors. A new initiative by Sydney Water, the Clearwater Teams Challenge held at North Wollongong saw our All Age Beach Relay team take out 1st place.

For the second consecutive year Simon Harris was selected to compete in the Surf League.

We also saw the return of the Surfboats representing Helensburgh Stanwell Park. Two U/19 crews competed in the Illawarra/South Coast Surfboat Series as well as the Branch, State and the Australian titles. Both crews achieved good results in their first season.

Our club was well represented at the Branch Championships that were held at Wollongong City Beach with many of our competitors gaining places in different events.

At the State Titles Simon Harris picked up a Silver medal in the Open Beach Flags. All competitors from our Club gave 110% performance and effort.

The Australian Championships saw a hearty number of competitors and many supporters travel north of the border to Kurrawa in March.

Secretarys Report

Committee Meetings

Management Committee meetings were scheduled and held monthly throughout the season, with the exception of the month of July. All meetings were conducted at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and were regularly attended by the committee members.

Two Executive Committee meeting were conducted at the Surf Club. Matters arising were reported to the following scheduled Management Committee meeting.

The Junior Activities Committee also met monthly at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club, with the Junior Activities delegates reporting regularly to the Management Committee.

The Stanwell Park Sea Eels Winter Swimming Club conducted unscheduled meetings, also at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and matters discussed were reported to the Management Committee.

Liquor Licence

The Club continues to maintain a Function Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption within the Club premises, with the licence held by Harley Dreghorn.

Statutory Requirements

The Annual Statement as required under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1984 was submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for the 2000-2001 year. An Australian Business Number (ABN) 92 267 821 862 is currently registered for the Club with the Registrar of the Australian Business Register and Commissioner of Taxation, Harley Dreghorn being the Public Officer.

The State Government introduced "Working With Children Check" under The Child Protection (Prohibited Employment) Act 1998 and the Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998, for checking paid and unpaid employees, such as volunteers, working with children and young people under the age of eighteen. The Act is current and working effectively within the Club. Evan Griffiths is the Child Protection Officer for the Illawarra Branch and Debra McCormack for our Club. All members who assist with this age group are required to sign a Prohibited Employment Declaration Form.

The Club is endorsed for entitlement to income tax exemption as a charitable entity under Subdivision 50-B of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 with the Australian Taxation Office.

Affiliation with Surf Life Saving Australia

As approved at the last Annual General Meeting, the Club applied for continuing affiliation with Surf Life Saving Australia.

Asset Register

The documentation and valuation of all Club equipment has been updated, but valuation of most assets still requires finalisation.

Membership Registration

The computerised database containing extensive details on all current members which is maintained and updated by the Club Registrar, Steven McDonald has been converted to conform with the new State initiated data system "Complete Patrol Logger" (CPL). The CPL system will cater for membership registration, patrol hours and all Surf Life Saving awards

Our current membership forms are pre-printed containing information provided by members the previous season. Upgrading of membership is minimal with only medical and minor changes to be noted.

Communicating with Members

The monthly circulation of the Park Bench, along with notices included as inserts, remains as our best form of communication with Club members. Our Publicity Officer Christine McDonald prepares the Park Bench from information provided by Club members and organises the monthly distribution. More input from members would be greatly appreciated.

Feedback from members is very positive, with members both new and old looking forward to receiving the newsletter. Circulation of the Park Bench is currently 268 to individuals and families.

Club House

The windows on the southern side of the Clubhouse that were replaced on all three levels by Wollongong City Council are to have installed a sub-sill to prevent further water entry into the club house. Council has also undertaken extensive repairs and painting at ground level for weathering to the pillar supports and the first floor.

Wollongong City Council also installed hot and cold water mixers to showers and wash rooms to prevent accidental scalding of patrons.

Frame work for the Junior's room within the men's amenities was constructed, unfortunately after many requests the room has not been cladded or the doors hung, this work has got to be a priority before the beginning of coming surf season.

The Club has submitted proposals with the Council and the Illawarra Branch Building Committee, for the addition of two bays, so that the Junior Section and Council gear can be adequately stored within the Club premises allowing for the removal of the two containers in the carpark. Council has responded by supplying a boundary definition plan and discussing the pros and cons of the extensions. Most of the discussion is of a positive nature.

Half of the profit raised from refreshment sales has been allocated to the special Building Account fund. At the end of the year, with the transfer of a further Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) representing half of this year's profit, the fund now stands at Twenty Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$20,400.00).

Sponsorship Agreement with HWC

In order to receive funding from the Helensburgh Workmens' Club Ltd., under the Community Development and Support Expenditure (CDSE) Scheme (Dept. of Gaming and Racing), our Club was required to enter into a Sponsorship Agreement. This mainly required staging a number of events at the HWC including meetings, presentations. Also require our members to join the HWC and support their staged events. Our Club fulfilled its commitments and are grateful for the funding from the Helensburgh Workmens' Club Ltd.

Once again sponsored by Westfields, our Club benefited from the supply of patrol uniforms to 11 new patrolling members, who gained their Surf Rescue Certificate. Thanks to Andrew Astill who coordinated the Rookies Scheme.

Our club is very fortunate to have so many members of this age group, it is my belief that over recent years we have come complacent and taken them for granted. That is, we just expected them to be there for patrols, fund raising and other club activities. It will take some member with initiative, time and above all, interest to support and encourage this group.

Surf Club Reunion

Over the past few years Jack McMillan has taken it virtually on himself to re-vamp the Surf Club Reunion and he has been successful in his efforts. Conclusion

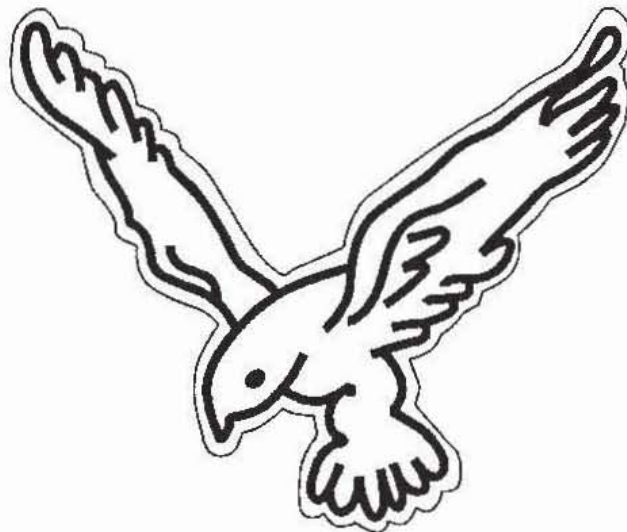
