At both the State and Australian Championships we saw a small but competitive team go away to represent our club. Though no medals were won, there were a great percentage of finalists, semi finalists and quarter finalists. As usual this year there were the yearly fundraisers, the car raffle, collection day and Anzac Day 2 Up at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club (HWC). Thanks to Jack McMillian for his countless hours spent selling raffle tickets at shopping centres and his helpful sidekick Peter McDonald for helping to raise \$4714. The work of these two members plus a small band of occasional helpers bolster funds for rescue equipment.



Chief Instructors Report

TRAINING AND AWARDS

This season showed continued support from club members for maintaining the core patrol strength of the club by obtaining an average number of Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificates. While other essential awards such as IRB Drivers and Advanced Resuscitation Certificate have unfortunately fallen to zero. Hopefully this will be addressed in the off season.

The 2002-03 season sees the end of the 31st Edition Training Manual with introduction of a new award syllabus, 32nd Edition of Surf Life Saving Training Manual and integration with Vocational Education Training System (VETS).



BRONZE MEDALLION

A good mix of new, old, young and mature members gained their Bronze Medallions this season. We have had some young members return after a few years break and some that have joined the club through the Sea Eels Winter Swimming Club. The club gained a total of 13 Bronze Medallions this season.

 The only change made to the Bronze Medallion for this season was the dropping of the IRB component due to the review of IRB driving and crewing practices during last season. The IRB Crewing component was picked up by the re-introduction of the IRB Crewperson Award.

Scott Boyle and Steven McDonald trained the 2 squads for the season. Scott Boyle claims that his squad was the longest running squad in the history of the club lasting for the whole season (a big claim but quite possibly true). The candidates put in 100% effort during all their training sessions and should be congratulated on gaining their Bronze Medallion.

SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE

Another strong season for the club with Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC), 16 in total. All of the candidates have come through the junior club. SRC candidates who have graduated from the junior club make excellent candidates and future patrol members due to the training they receive with Surf Ed.

The members trained in the Run-Swim-Run, Resuscitation, Basic First Aid, Signals, Patrols, Surf Skills and Rescue Techniques.

Geoff Ryder and Peter McDonald once again put the candidates through their paces on a weekly basis, meeting some tight deadlines just for competition along the way. It is a pre-requisite that members must have their SRC to compete at the Inter-branch carnivals. The requirement compresses the amount of time available to properly train candidates and leaves them somewhat underdone when it comes to passing the exam. Thankfully our members are dedicated and along with very good instructors get everyone through. Thank you also to Shannon Cummings and Murray Dowling who helped out with the SRC training.

ADVANCED RESUSCITATION CERTIFICATE

No squads were trained this season.

There was one change to the ARC this season, in the addition of the Oropharyngeal (Guedel) Airway to the syllabus. Prior to this season life savers were not allowed to insert the Oropharyngeal (Guedel) Airway, and had to leave it to trained professional ie; Ambulance officers or doctors. With the appropriate training and use of a special dummy, life savers may now insert the Oropharyngeal (Guedel) Airway.

PROFICIENCY TESTS

As with past seasons, two proficiency days were organised for the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate, unfortunately some seriously big seas delayed the second of the days. The cancelling of proficiency tests has a big effect on the number of proficient members the club ends up with at the end of the season. As you will see below our numbers have fallen since last season. Advanced Resuscitation Certificate proficiencies were held over two weeks and were well attended. IRB Drivers maintained their good proficiency record for the club; it is essential that all drivers maintain their proficiency as we have only just enough to satisfactorily cover patrols.

The Bronze Medallion Proficiency changed this year due to the review into IRB crewing practices. Surf Life Saving decided that all members needed an indepth refresher on how to be an IRB Crewperson, so this became a separate proficiency day. All other aspects of the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate proficiency remained the same. Run-Swim-Run, Tube & Board Rescues, 1 and 2 Person Resuscitation, Signals and Surf Awareness were tested.

The ARC had an additional component this season with the inclusion of the Oropharyngeal Airway into the ARC award. Jeff Lucke and Evan Griffiths ran two training/proficiency sessions to educate ARC holders in the technique of correctly inserting the airway. The demonstration was enhanced thanks to the loan of a Oropharyngeal Airway dummy from Surf Life Saving Illawarra. All ARC holders who did not attend the proficiency will be required to update their skills next season.

IRB Drivers and Crewperson went through an in-depth review of driving and crewing practices for their proficiency this season. The aim of this review was to ensure that all members have a satisfactory understanding of what is required from them while driving or crewing the IRB. It was disappointing that more members didn't attend the IRB Crew proficiencies, as this limits the number of members the club has qualified to crew the IRB for next season.

On the whole a good season for the club in terms of the number of proficient members available to perform patrol duties. The club thanks the members who took the time to complete their proficiency. A great team of examiners lead by Jeff Lucke and Evan Griffiths, ably assisted by Peter Beehag, Mark Thompson, Peter O'Halloran, Peter Turner and myself.

CONCLUSION

Overall the club has had a good season for awards and proficiencies, as always the club can do better in terms of numbers of awards and proficiencies. It is essential that the club seeks out new members to join the club and that we get them into training early in the season, basically we do not want members training all the way through a season. Anyone who wishes to be an instructor or just wants to help out on a Sunday morning would be most welcome. Maybe you have your ARC or are an IRB Driver then there is nothing to stop you from forming a squad and starting to train. There are many existing instructors who would love to give you a hand.

Thanks to the great crew of instructors that got us through the season Evan Griffiths, Jeff Lucke, Bobo White, Scott Boyle, Shannon Cummings, Peter McDonald, Murray Dowling, and Geoff Ryder. Your assistance is much appreciated.

Congratulations to all the members who gained an award during the season or made it through another proficiency test. Gaining an award or becoming proficient ensures that Helensburgh Stanwell Park SLSC is a strong patrolling club for this season, next season and into the future.

Thank you also to my wife Jodie, who was pregnant with our first child for the entire season and was very understanding, we now have a wonderful baby boy "Lachlan Peter" who we look forward to signing up in a few years time.

Secretarys Report

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Management Committee meetings were scheduled and held monthly throughout the season, with the exception of the month of July. All meetings were conducted at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and were regularly attended by the committee members.

Two Executive Committee meetings were conducted at the Surf Club and one at the beginning of the season between the Senior and Junior Executive at the HWC. Matters arising were reported to the following scheduled Management Committee meeting.

The Junior Activities Committee also met monthly at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club, with the Junior Activities delegates reporting regularly to the Management Committee.

The Stanwell Park Sea Eels Winter Swimming Club conducted unscheduled meetings, also at the Helensburgh Workmen's Club and matters discussed were reported to the Management Committee.

The Surf Club Re-union, Ocean Swim and the 95th Anniversary Year committees also conducted meetings and reported to the following scheduled Management Committee meeting.

ASSET REGISTER

The documentation of all Club equipment has been updated, see listing. New equipment acquired this season were two surfboats, IRB motor, electric crane hoist, new alarm system, IRB motor trolley, board rack, loud hailer, stretcher, and four heaters.

Equipment disposed of, were the "Dick Richards" surfboat, Juniors storage container, IRB hull and motor, and a bar refrigerator.

LIQUOR LICENCE

The Club continues to maintain a Function Licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption within the Club premises, the licence is held by Harley Dreghorn. The Club is currently applying for a new function licence as granted through State Parliament to surf clubs. The new licence has fewer restrictions and will permit the holding of functions for non-members of the club.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The Annual Statement as required under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1984 was submitted to the Department of Fair Trading for the 2001-2002 year.

An Australian Business Number (ABN) 92 267 821 862 is currently registered for the Club with the Registrar of the Australian Business Register and Commissioner of Taxation, Harley Dreghorn being the Public Officer.

The Club is endorsed for entitlement to income tax exemption as a charitable entity, under Subdivision 50-B of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 with the Australian Taxation Office.

AFFILIATION WITH SURF LIFE SAVING AUSTRALIA As approved at the last Annual General Meeting, the Club applied for continuing affiliation with Surf Life Saving Australia.

MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION

Our current membership forms are pre-printed containing information provided by members from the previous season. Upgrading of membership is minimal with only medical and minor changes to be noted. State initiated data system "Complete Patrol Logger" (CPL) now caters for membership registration, patrol hours and all Surf Life Saving Awards. Because of a number of short comings with this new system, especially with the recording of SLS Awards, the club's own computerised database containing extensive details on all current members is still being maintained and updated by the Club Registrar, Steven McDonald.

COMMUNICATING WITH MEMBERS

Seven editions of the Park Bench were produced with a circulation of 300 copies posted to members, families and supporters of our club. This along with notices included as inserts, remains our best form of communication with Club members. The Junior Activities Committee also produced nine newsletters, which were handed out at Sunday Pointscores. Our Publicity Officer Christine McDonald prepares the Park Bench from information provided by Club members and organises the monthly distribution. More input from members would be greatly appreciated as feedback from members is very positive, with members both new and old looking forward to receiving the newsletter.

In March, Shannon Cummings and Steven McDonald initiated our club website www.stanwellparksurfclub.com to provide further information for members. Although still in its early development stage, information is available for viewing for club programs, coming events, membership information and all newsletters. First to make use of the website was the Ocean Swim committee who provided information and entry forms for the competitors. Publicity Officers, Julie Humphries for the JAC section made regular junior and senior news contributions and Steve Clark for the Sea Eels WSC also produced articles for the local newspapers. The efforts of all those involved in publicity for our club is immeasurable and enhances the club's standing within the community.

CLUB HOUSE FUNCTIONS

The increased use of the clubhouse for functions has greatly assisted the club's finances. The work involved falls mainly on a few members who volunteer their time and services. This involves the cleaning, being available to assist at functions, organising of liquor licences and restocking of consumables. Special thankyou to Bill Haran our Bar Manager, who provides a smooth running well stocked bar.

Half of the profit raised from refreshment sales during the year (\$3,000) has been allocated to the special Building Account fund. The fund now stands at Twenty Eight Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$28,300).

CLUB HOUSE

The Junior's storage room has finally been completed. The temporary container that stored the Junior's equipment for far too long has been removed. Thank you to those who in some way assisted with this project.

Despite ongoing meetings, letters and phone calls with Wollongong City Council, a number of issues have still not been resolved. The windows on the southern side of the Club house still leak and are a safety issue because of the low level sills, entrance stairs are a slip hazard, carpark entrance gate needs replacing and the grassed area at the front of the surf club requires attention along with the paths leading to the beach.

Proposals for the addition of storage two bays, submitted with the WCC and the Illawarra Branch Building Committee has no further advanced, despite a number of on-site meetings with WCC. Not enhancing our cause is the lack of an organised approach to this project. The call for a committee to be formed went unheeded.

OH&S COMMITTEE

Fortunately some members were already considering these concerns and Geoff Coleman, Harley Dreghorn and Mat White formed the OH&S Committee. These names have been submitted to SLS NSW who are in the process of drafting policies for OH&S. Terms of reference for the committee are to involve relevant Club officers in inspection and discussions, identify safety issues, report findings and recommendations to the Management Committee. All safety issues identified and concerning the surf club building and surroundings have been referred to the Wollongong City Council for attention.

ROOKIE PROGRAM

The Branch Rookie Program lost its major sponsor this season, but thanks to the SLS Illawarra Branch, our Club benefited from the supply of patrol uniforms, rash vests and hats to our 16 new patrolling members, who gained their Surf Rescue Certificate.

Our club is very fortunate to have so many members of this age group, it is my belief that over recent years we have come complacent and taken them for granted. That is, we just expected them to be there for patrols, fund raising and other club activities. It will take some member with initiative, time and above all, interest to support and encourage this group.

CONCLUSION

Another busy season that leaves the Club once again in a very well respected manner by both Surf Life Saving and the community. Many members have taken it on themselves to ensure the Club's continued success, in Patrols, training and competition, fund raising, Junior Activities and general cleaning and maintenance of the clubhouse and equipment.

Special thankyou to three members, Mark Stares and Geoff Coleman who took on their new positions as IRB Captain and Chief First Aid Officer respectively with enthusiasm and professionalism. Debra McCormack for her support, 100% attendance at meetings, assistance with the Park Bench and organising another very successful Presentation Evening.

To all the Club members who have contributed during the 2002–2003 season, in this our 95th Year thankyou, your help has not gone unnoticed.






 Stanwell Park, for the second time hosted the Coalcliff to Stanwell Park


Team Captains Report

Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge Report





Chairpersons Report



Sea Eels Secretaries Report

Winter swimming aims to promote the camaraderie of Surf Life Saving and the maintenance of swimming fitness throughout the winter months. There is also a certain bravado and daring-do with which we enjoy mystifying our non-winter swimming acquaintances. This is good for both our own self-esteem and justification, and for rattling those lesser mortals who can't get out of their nice warm beds on a Sunday morning.

We are in a strong financial position, have met or exceeded our stated goals and have provided many new and existing swimmers with achievable challenges. All of these activities are good for our youngsters and those of CRAM House, the adults who swim, and our communities.

81 members commenced the 2002 season, our fourteenth with two Associates and 79 active swimmers, some more actively swimming than others. On the 20 Sunday morning swims, we averaged 40 swimmers. Overall, eight swimmers gained 100% attendance and we continued our increase over previous years on our Bring-A-Friend Day. Nice to know there are only five friends gullible enough to turn up.

We have fielded a team at every Titles contested over the 14 seasons since the club's inception. Last season, the Sea Eels finished second overall and first on handicap in the Championships of the South Coast Winter Swimming Association. For such a small and relatively young club, we also acquitted ourselves satisfactorily in the National Titles of the Winter Swimming Association of Australia, making it into several finals.

COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

Executive Committee: The well-earned but premature retirement at the last AGM of the perennial Secretary, Peter McDonald, gave myself, Phil Kelly a totally unexpected and unlooked-for entry into the secret machinations of this Club. Ian Van Zyl and celebrity Fines Captains had an exceptional season, with members willing to pay, just to get the saga over and done with. Thanks also to Ryan Van Zyl for excellent fine collecting.

Swimming Committee: The Swimming Committee made sure that our average of 40 swimmers for 20 point score swims, a visit to the Bulli Sea Lions and the contesting of the Club, South Coast and Australian Championships all ran very smoothly. Thank you enormously to our handicappers Steven McDonald, Rob Pugh and Peter O'Halloran, Chief Time Keeper Hilton Barnett and his helpers and our Chief Judge Paul Robberds, and judges Murray Dowling, and Glenn Trewin.

The less visible and glamorous task of SCWSA delegates were again fulfilled by Rob Pugh, and the now "Free of Crappy Jobs" Peter Mac. Our Club's thanks are extended to you two.

Being Bar Manager to a bunch of Winter Swimmers is second only to managing a Bar for a Clubhouse of Boaties: a medal and our thanks go to Bill Haran.

Steve Clark and Michelle Heiler continued the interest and improvement in our publicity. Special thanks also go to Peter Mac for compiling the Park Bench which never fails to mention our Club, and also to Julie Humphries for getting the Information in the off-season.


