On behalf of the Management Committee, I submit for your perusal and adoption the 107th Annual Report of the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club covering activities for the year ended 30 June 2014.

Financial Statements are also included in the report and cover the 12 months ended 31 March 2014.

Main highlights of the year:

- Patrol members achieve the Club's objective of no lives lost whilst patrols were on duty
- > 17 Bronze Medallions and 17 Surf Rescue Certificates gained
- Education of our Junior members continues to prepare them for eventual transition to patrolling lifesaver
- > Continued financial support from government and the community enable the Club to update its rescue equipment
- The club has been successful in a grant application to purchase a new IRB Hull
- The Club Launched the 100 years history book "Vigilance and Service"
- Don Burke made Life Member of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park SLSC
- > The Club purchased and Launch a new boat christened the Robert "Bobo" White
- > The Club achieved its best ever result at the NSW and Australian Titles coming 7th and 16th respectively

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To all members of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park SLSC

This report highlights the 107th season of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club providing lifesaving services of Stanwell Park Beach, actively protecting the ocean going public, educating and training club members to provide this service, encouraging further development of members through competition, and promoting the safe and friendly environment associated with Surf Life Saving.

This season the club successfully patrolled Stanwell Park Beach and continues to honour the record of "No Lives Lost" during patrolling hours, the clubs record contributing to "No Lives Lost" on Illawarra Beaches in the 2013/2014 Season. The club had 8 patrols rostered during the season with 120+ patrol members patrolling from September to April. More than 30 members gained 100% patrol attendance, including a number of Nippers who gained their SRC during the season completing 100% of their rostered patrols.

All of this was done under the guidance of the club's new Club Captain, Aaron Abela and Vice-captain Toby Lea. Aaron and Toby stepped up to their role mid-season on a very steep learning curve, and were able to maintain the club's high patrolling standard. Aaron and Toby were supported by new Patrol Secretary Peter McDonald, who maintained the club's patrolling records, made sure the patrol log was ready each weekend, and that members performed their patrols as rostered.

Outstanding patrol performance and participation was recognised at the Annual Patrol Dinner, with Matt Webber being named Patrol Member of the Year. Matt is a conscientious patrol member who takes the time to engage with younger patrol members, act as a mentor and provide outstanding patrol service for the club. Two new Surf Rescue Certificate members Chloe Gale and Jayden Curkoski where awarded with High Achievement Awards for their contribution in their first season as patrol members.

Surf Life Saving NSW awarded the club with a Branch "Rescue of the Month" for a rescue performed on 31 March 2014, involving members from the club and Coalcliff Surf Life Saving Club. Ian Pepper assisted in the rescue of 2 swimmers late on a Monday afternoon after the Council Lifeguards had signed off for the day. An elderly swimmer got into trouble at the north end of the beach, and a student from Heathcote High School attempted an initial rescue.

Members from Coalcliff with the assistance of local surfers were able to secure the patient who was in a bad way and return him to shore. The patient was unconscious and not breathing, CPR was commenced and after a number of compressions started to respond to the rescuer. In the meantime the student who had attempted the initial rescue was now in difficulty, Ian Pepper was able to secure the patient and return him to shore. Reports from the scene indicated that all people involved seemed to automatically perform their role as trained,

and that there was a sense of clam on the beach despite the drama of the situation. Both patients made a full recovery. A big vote of thanks to those involved in this successful rescue.

Thankyou to all club members who actively patrolled Stanwell Park Beach during the season, dedicating around 40 hours each to surf life saving. Your participation enables the club to maintain its record of "No Lives Lost" during patrolling hours.

Chief Training Officer Bobo White led a strong "Education Team" during the season. The strength of the team was recognised by Surf Life Saving Illawarra at the 2013/2014 Awards of Excellence, being named "Team of the Year". The "Education Team" trained 17 Surf Rescue Certificates and 17 Bronze Medallions, as well as maintaining patrol member proficiency status for these awards. Along with these awards they also trained a number of Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, IRB Driver and Crew Awards.

The role of the trainer and assessor is becoming increasingly demanding with more components being loaded into the various awards, and a higher level of compliance to ensure members are being trained correctly and the expected outcomes are achieved. Fortunately the club has a good number of members putting up their hand to become a trainer and be part of the "Education Team".

It is also very encouraging to see younger club members like Ryan Van Zyl, Stephanie McGuinness and Amy-Leigh Perrin actively training members. The club appreciates the "Education Team's" role in maintaining the high standard of life savers patrolling Stanwell Park Beach.

Recognition of a member's contribution to the club is generally given thru the awarding of "Club Member of the Year". This season recognised a group of members who have made an extended contribution to the club in the compiling of the club's history from 1908 – 2008. The History Book Committee consisting of Evan Griffiths, Jim Powell, Debra McCormack and Harley Dreghorn were named as Club Members of the Year for season 2013/2014.

President's Report

These core members of the committee have combined over more than 8 seasons meeting on a regular basis, researching and collating the club history. The end product being "Vigilance & Service" with more 300 pages, and numerous photos and stories of the club history. The book is surely one of the better surf club history books produced in recent times. The committee also acknowledged the many members who contributed time, stories and photos to the book during its production.

On 13 April 2014 the club launched "Vigilance & Service" at Helensburgh Workers, Sports & Social Club. The Event was attended by 18 of the club 27 living Life Members, Wollongong Lord Mayor, SLSI President, Local Members of Parliament, representatives from Peabody Energy and the book Printers, and more than 100 club members, family and friends. 127 copies of the book were sold on or before the launch and a very successful auction of 5 books was conducted, with the top price being paid for a book signed by all living Life Members of the club.

The History Book Committee was recognised for their work, with Debra McCormack and Jim Powell being made Honorary Members of the club. The launch was a great day which quickly became a reunion of club members with many members catching up and reliving the fading memories revitalised by the book.

Life Membership of the Club is not granted lightly, with special consideration of a member's service, their contribution to the continued improvement and growth of the club. At the 2013/2014 AGM member Don Burke was made a Life Member of the Club. Don gained his Bronze Medallion in 1982, and soon after his IRB Crew and Driver. He competed with great success in his early years with the club on the Beach and in the IRB, his later competition achievements have been in the Surf Boat. Don was a Patrol Captain, Club Captain and Vicepresident, and served on a number committees. He has been a great fund-raiser for the club organising some recent very successful fundraising events. In recent time his interest has turned to the Junior Section of the club as

his children progressed thru Nippers. Don, his "South Sydney Apron" and his wife Deb seem to have become a permanent fixture in the canteen and on the BBQ. Well done Don.

It was a year for launches with the launch of a new Surf Boat. Life Member of the club, Illawarra and New South Wales Robert "Bobo" White was honoured with his name on the new boat. The launch was well attended by Life Members and club members, and witnessed a handpicked crew to launch the boat into a slight surf. The launch crew consisted of Brooke Dent, Chris Ryder, Ed White, Toby Lea and Sweep Mark "Bluey" Lea. Congratulations to Bobo and wife Kerry for this special honour. Let's hope the boat continues its run of success gained to date.

In the competition arena the club had what could only be deemed as the most successful season of recent times. The club finished 19th at the Australian Championships, 7th at the NSW Open Championships and 22nd at the NSW Age Championships. A tremendous effort for a club with a relatively small team and few water competitors, the club is certainly punching above its weight. The success had been in no small part due to 2 extremely dedicated coaches and mentors, being Daniel Robberds for the beach and Mark "Bluey" Lea in the boats.



Both of Daniel and Bluey have been able to draw competitors from local members and reach out to other clubs with competitive members looking to be part of a growing and successful team. What impresses me with the teams is the bonds that have been formed within each of the teams, and between the teams, they live and breathe surf life saving and competition.

The team bonds have helped them achieve the successes in this season, at the NSW Championship winning both the Male and Female Open Beach Relays, taking home Aussies Gold in the U/19 and Open Female Beach Relays, and Aussies Silver in the Open Female Boat Race. Individually club members performed at the highest level, Katie Mott winning Aussies Gold in the U/19 Female Beach Sprint, and Avalon Punch winning Aussies Gold in the U/17 Female Beach Flags. All results from the Australian Championship, NSW Open and Age Championships, Illawarra Branch Championships will be detailed later in the report.

A surf life saving club cannot exist without the on-going support of the local community, local businesses and club members. The "2508" community donated around \$5,000 to the club during the Annual Appeals Day, in recognition of the communities continuing support the club will be launching a new IRB at the start of the 2014/2015 Season named "2508". Peabody Energy honoured their commitment to support the club's capital program over a 3 year period with the final contribution of \$9,500. Adding to these significant contributions there have been numerous other donors who have enabled the club to purchase new life saving, training and competition equipment. A special mention to Carl Williams for his efforts to provide competition boards and skis to garner interest in water completion within the club, these are now available for use by club members.

Unfortunately weather had a big impact on one of the clubs major fundraising events forcing the cancellation of the Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge. Large surf at Coalcliff and Stanwell Park Beach caused the event organisers to review conditions in the hours leading up to the race, and eventually made the decision after considering many options to cancel the event for the year. Despite some

complaints, it was the correct decision to make with the safety of the participants and water safety foremost in everyone's minds. Hopefully conditions will be more favourable for the swim next year. Thanks to the event organisers, water safety and club members who turned up to assist with the event.

Friday Night Drinks continued during the season, and is starting to have flow on effects within the club. It is generating funds for the various groups who host the nights being The Beachies, The Boaties, The Seagulls and The Sea Eels. Any profits generated on the nights from food sales going to each of the groups. The regular opening of the club on a Friday Night has created a meeting point for the Stanwell Park locals, who frequently start their weekend at the surf club, they have even gone so far to organise special get togethers to coincide with Friday Night Drinks. It is quickly becoming an institution in "The Park". The food offering is varied and of good quality, each of the groups should be commended for the effort that they put into making these nights successful.

The future of the club is sound, membership is consistent and patrol strength remains in excess of 100 active members, and the Juniors are maintaining a fantastic breeding ground for future life savings. The club is led by an enthusiastic Executive and Management Committee who are keen to take the club in a different direction into the future. The Seagulls Committee are looking to increase the focus on education and lifesaving skills, and aim to get even more competitors into the water. The senior club is always looking at ways to improve the club amenity, increase social activities and increase the lifesaving skillset at the club. To make any change within such an organisation the various committees need the support of the membership, any contribution by members is more than welcome and encouraged.

In my first season in the role I have appreciated the support of the committee and the many members who just do what needs to be done around the club. You would be surprised how many things just happen be it preparing the IRB for patrol, sweeping out the club house, repairing rescue boards, stocking the First Aid Room, emptying garbage bins, entering competitors in carnivals, washing patrol hats, collecting membership fees, training new Bronze Medallions, stocking the bar, and many other small things that are required to make this club tick.

The book was officially unveilled by Tanya Potter, the first female to gain their Bronze Medallion at the club, Alicia McCormack, the first club member to win a medal at the Olympics, and Wollongong Lord Mayor Gordon Bradbery.

Tanya and Alicia spoke about their experiences at the club from a female perspective. Tanya in gaining acceptance as a female life saver, and Alicia growing up in surf life saving enabling her to follow her dream to win an Olympic Medal.

HSP Raises Funds to Purchase 2 New Surfboats in 2001

At the end of the 2000/2001 surf lifesaving season, the boaties set about an ambitious plan to raise money for not one, but two brand new surfboats. With each surfboat costing \$20,000+ at the time, the target was going to be a stretch to say the least. The club had recently recruited two new junior crews into its ranks after a brief hiatus in surfboat rowing over the preceding seasons.

At the 2001 Australian Surf Lifesaving Titles held at Kurrawa, Helensburgh Stanwell Park SLSC took out the gold and silver medals for the heaviest boats to be used in competition at the carnival. In a unique twist of irony, the boat which was held to be the lighter of the two, the "Evan Griffiths", ended up being the heaviest of the two boats that the club owned. It was shame that all season we had been leaving the carrying of "the light boat" till last at each carnival when it came time to pack up at the end of the day. With the new juniors looking more like greyhounds than buff rowers, the decision to aim for two

new boats was taken. Leading the charge in executing this plan to purchase two new surfboats was Don Burke.

In August of 2001, a trivia and auction night was held at Engadine Bowling Club. The night was an outstanding success with many people involved, ultimately delivering the club two brand new south coast surfboats. Supplementing the fundraising on the night was Don's efforts in obtaining sponsorship for the purposes of purchasing surfboats. The amount raised via donations was \$27421.92, a substantial amount in 2001 which would be equivalent to approximately \$40,000 in today's (2014) dollars.

The legacy of the fundraising efforts from the boat section, under the direction of Boat Captain Don Burke, lives on to this day. The club still has 2 near new boats used in competition which get renewed regularly in order to keep the club competitive. A third boat was acquired in a later season to be used as a training boat. The HSP Boaties of today have a lot to thank Don for in kicking off this renaissance of surfboat rowing at Stanwell Park



On the 2nd February 2014, Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club christened its newest surf boat and celebrated a long serving member's surf life saving career in the naming of the boat.

Around 100 club members, family and friends, including 16 life members of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving were on hand to help celebrate the christening of the club new surf boat.

The surf boat was funded thru the sale of a surf boat, Friday Night Drinks and the on-going support of Peabody (Metropolitan Coal).

The club member joined Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club 50 years ago this season as a nipper and gained his Bronze Medallion in 1970. Over the years he held many positions within the club including Club Captain, Instructor, Chief Instructor, Vice President, Secretary, and District Supervisor. He went on to support the Illawarra Branch in a number of roles mainly around instruction and examinations, and more recently (the last 30 odd years) as a competition official. He has officiated at the highest levels of surf life saving competition - Branch, State, National and World Championship, and has been a sectional referee in the craft & swim areas at the Australian Championships.

For the past 7 seasons his focus moved to surf boats, and again became heavily involved in the boat area as a supporter of the club and carnival official. The timeframe lines up with when one of his boys passed the "boatie test" and jumped in a surf boat.

Apart from his roles in an official capacity in surf life saving, he has been a consistent club member

contributing in many aspects of club life and supporting the club on many levels, including the recent club house renovations, being a committed winter swimmer, and a patrol member.

The club's new surf boat will bear the name of Club Life Member, Illawarra Branch Life Member and Surf Life Saving NSW Life Member Robert "Bobo" White.

"Bobo" Christened the Surf Boat the Robert "Bobo" White assisted by his wife Kerry, and sons Ed and Russell.

The surf boat was launched with a crew consisting of Brooke Dent, Chris Ryder, Ed White, Toby Lea and Sweep Mark "Bluey" Lea.

I would like to thank the Surf Club for giving me the honour of having a surfboat named after me. I was very appreciative of everyone who helped me celebrate that special day, especially the Club Executive, Bluey and his Boatie Fraternity, the bar & catering people, Life Members and my family and friends.

As most people know I had the false impression that the boat was to be named after our first Aussie Gold Medal winners, the Under 23 Women and I was happy about that. It wasn't until Steve McDonald began the introduction that I knew I had been out-smarted, and what an unexpected surprise it was!

It was obvious that a lot of planning had gone into the day and into keeping the secret from me. Bluey did a great job in selecting a boat crew. I had history with all the crew members and had been involved with their Bronze training (except Bluey). Kerry and I were very proud as we watched the boat being carried high on the shoulders of members, and then being rowed successfully in and out of the surf. Thank you - Bluey, Chris Ryder, Ed White, Brook Dent and Josh Lea.

Kerry and I go to almost all the boat carnivals and every time we see that "fast blue boat" on the beach it makes us feel very proud.

Gator might boast about having his boat win the first Aussie Gold but I had two Champion crews make the Sunday finals at the Aussie Championships at Scarbro. The girls won a spectacular silver medal and the young U19 boys deservedly earned a fantastic fifth.

Earlier in the year the "fast blue boat' had a great start for the "The Park" when the girls won the ASRL (Australian Surfboat Rowers League) Open Women's event in its first competition. This race is second only in prestige to the Aussies, even though more boats competed at the ASRL carnival.

Kerry and I are enjoying our "day in the sun" but the most important thing is watching all these young people putting so much effort and time into surfboats for Stanwell Park.

Illawarra Rescue of the Month

I was involved in a dramatic rescue of two people at Stanwell Park beach yesterday. It was at the north end around 5.30pm whilst surfing with my kids and a few of their friends.

I noticed someone being helped to shore and paddled over to assist. It was one of my neighbours who was completely unconscious, no pulse and not breathing. Two of my friends were assisting from Coalcliff surf club and we commenced CPR.

Miraculously the man was revived after a few minutes. He was flown to Wollongong by the Westpac chopper and should be fine. The man had been caught in a rip while having a short swim close to shore. He is around 50 to 60 and not unfit but not really a good swimmer. A wave pushed him off the sand bank and into the channel where he was swept north towards the pinnacles in a rip. I guess he panicked and put up his hand around now.

A year 12 student from Bosco saw the man in trouble from the car park on the hill and raced down to assist. He grabbed my friends surf board and yelled about a man drowning. It was not clear to anyone on the beach what was happening for another few minutes and then the man was spotted waving his arms up north behind the rocks.

The two coalcliff club members went to assist but the man was bobbing under water for long periods and everyone found it hard to find him. He was then swept 100m south underwater and suddenly came to the surface near one of the coalcliff guys. As he was being taken to shore he was assisted by other surfers including me

It was then after the man was brought back to life that one of the kids noticed another man waving for help in the rip. It was the year 12 boy who had lost the surfboard and was now in trouble himself. I saw the surfboard on the shore that he had lost and paddled out to his assistance with the board. He was exhausted, hysterical and had swallowed a lot of water but was ok. He was later taken to hospital for checking.

The heroes from coalcliff were Ben Rennie and Chris Farmer. The surfer who gave the life saving heart pumps was Craig Bruce. Jo riley and Tanya Pepper were also present and assisted the victims and communicating to 000. The main victim was Ion Pearce of Chellowdene in Stanwell Park. His wife Sabrina and daughter Shalan were notified and made it to the scene before Ion was taken away. The Bosco boy was called Chris.

Many kids from the area all witnessed the event and hopefully learned why surf club is so important. I know mine did and will never forget what they witnessed.

On Monday 31 March at 5:25pm, a Heathcote High School student noticed a person needing assistance and asked a member of the public to borrow his surfboard. Shortly after noticing a man approximately 50-60 metres off shore in trouble, Coalcliff Lifesavers Chris Farmer and Ben Rennie ran down the beach and into the water and headed out into the surf to assist.


When Farmer and Rennie made it out to the sandbar they could not locate the patient. A local surfer helped with the search, looking for the patient above and below the surface. Once there was a lull in the surf, the patient surfaced on his back and unconscious. Rennie attempted to get a response from the patient, but there was none. Rennie lifted the patient onto the local surfer's board and headed for the shore. Due to the large surf conditions the Lifesavers faced some challenges but successfully paddled the patient in to the shore within two minutes thanks to additional help from other surfers in the area.

Once safely on dry sand, the patient's vital signs were checked with the patient not responding, still unconscious and not breathing. Rennie and Farmer commenced CPR without hesitation giving the patient two rescue breaths before commencing compressions. While performing compressions the Lifesavers noticed the patient's eyes flicker and he began taking shallow breaths. Lifesavers placed the patient into the recovery position. Initially there was little response to simple commands, however, over time his responses and vital signs began to improve. At this stage a member of the public who was a registered nurse arrived and assisted in the patient care.

While the CPR was occuring, Ian Pepper, a member of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park SLSC, observed that the initial rescuer from Heathcote High School had lost the surfboard he was paddling and was now struggling in the treacherous surf conditions. Pepper paddled out on his surfboard to rescue him. The patient was hysterical and had taken in a lot of water. Pepper got him on his board and calmed him down before returning to shore safely.

Once back on shore, Pepper stayed with the patient, reassuring him. While this was occurring, Rennie and Farmer were administering oxygen to the initial patient until the Police and Ambulance arrived. Duty Officer, Anthony Turner, arrived on scene approximately 20 minutes after receiving the call from the State Operations Centre.

During the incident there was a sense of calm and control among everyone involved in the rescue and management of the patients and communications were maintained with SurfCom and Emergency Services. Both patients were taken to Wollongong Hospital for further assessment and treatment and later released.





Lifesaving and Patrols

First of all I would like to thank every patrolling member that volunteered their spare time over the course of the 2013-14 season to patrol our beautiful beach and help uphold our number one priority of having zero fatalities this season.

This year our 8 patrols had a rostered 85 shifts on the beach, with an approximate total rostered time of 370 hours. Just like previous seasons, attendance during the school holiday period is crucial as it is our busiest time on the beach. Your commitment to turn up to Saturday patrols and public holidays is great to see and I would like to thank you all for the additional time you gave to protect our beach this season. Your hard work and dedication on the beach is essential for the club to function as well as it does.

Pete McDonald, with help from his wife Sandra was patrol secretary this season, and he did an awesome job looking after our patrol logs, keeping surf guard up to date and looking after the roster. Thank you both for everything; it was a job well done.

Iris Huizinga has done a great job over the season as our first aid and radio officer. Since stepping up last season after Geoff Coleman was unfortunately unable to continue in the role she has done a great job of keeping our oxy tanks full, kits stocked and radios serviced. Towards the end of the season Mike Malherbe took over for Iris while she went away and kept everything in check. Thank you both Iris and Mike for putting in the time to enable everything to run so smoothly.

Our IRB Captain Gaz Marshall has put in the hours to keep our IRBs ready to go for our patrols and muster up help when needed for water safety for events such as the Ocean Swim. Your help is Greatly appreciated Gary.

Just to mention, we now have a new inflatable member as part of the team. The new IRB will be up and running for patrol use next season

I would like to take this opportunity to request to all patrol members to always keep the task at hand in mind. Public safety on the beach always remains paramount. Whether you're sitting up in the clubhouse on a rainy day or on the beach under the shelter you must always keep your mind on preventing any swimmers in the water from coming to harm. The best patrol is one that has no rescues over the season. Prevention of incident is what we strive for.

Both Toby and I would like to take the time to congratulate those involved in the rescue of local swimmer Ion Pearce in late march, for which both Stanwell Park and Coalcliff were awarded 'rescue of the month'.

After becoming stuck in a rip, Ion lost consciousness at sea and was successfully returned to the beach and revived with CPR techniques, during which time an

ambulance was called. Trained members of both Stanwell Park and Coalcliff surf club were involved in the successful outcome of this incident and this rescue emphasizes the importance of what we do.

As many of you may be aware, our annual Ocean Swim this year did not go ahead due to dangerous surf conditions. This was unfortunate as it generates a lot of money for the club, but in the end the agreed management plan for this event worked and prevented any incidents.

While this is a fine example of what we as surf life savers trained for, we as club captain and vice club captain, would like to congratulate all members of our patrols for your commitment to patrols this season which has surely prevented many more tragedies.

This Season we have had patrols every Sunday, with Saturday patrols being integrated into the roster during the peak of the season. There has been much discussion within the club about the whether or not these Saturday patrols are necessary. At the April Management meeting we had a SLS Illawarra rep come and discuss with us our view on Saturday patrols and give feedback as to whether our club as a whole wanted Saturday Patrols.

Our response was a definite "No" as that we do not believe that they are necessary, although we agreed that if we had to do them we would strongly suggest to do Saturday patrols over the weeks we find the most popular on our beach.

A tremendous thank-you goes out to the members that gave their time to watch the beach on the two volunteer patrols we had this season due to the dates being overlooked in the roster. The 22nd Dec & 27th Jan patrols were among the biggest and best-qualified patrols over the entire season. The turnout of members whether it was for a make-up or just volunteer patrol was astounding.

"Patrol 8 had finished and were about to leave when we spotted a group of people getting swept out off the sand bank. I (Jayden) went out on the board and Hamilton followed me with a tube.

We reached the group of people and I decided to get the person that looked like they were most in trouble. I then asked her to help me get her on the board but she refused so Hamilton put her in the tube instead and returned her to shore safely.

I rescued another person from the group of stranded people.

After that we stayed for the afternoon patrol"

Congratulations must also go to the Junior Section and Education Team for producing such outstanding lifesavers. It is testament to the quality of people we have involved in both the juniors and education for the training our upcoming lifesavers.



Helensburgh – Stanwell Park is very fortunate to have so many members who are willing to assist with the training and assessing of our members especially our patrolling members.

Illawarra Sand Rats Sensation

Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club's success story continued in the junior ranks at the three-day NSW Surf Life Saving Age Championships staged at Umina and Ocean beaches on the Central Coast.

Beach coach Daniel Robberds, a former competitor, is credited with the club's outstanding ascent in the last three years, and ability to draw on the pick of local talent.

Brock Scrivener has been a runaway nippers sensation for many years. He switched clubs this season to be part of the Illawarra's surf life saving beach team, known as the 'sand rats'.

On the opening day of competition in driving rain and with the wind blowing onshore he won his favourite event, the Under 14 boys beach flags. The win was his sixth from seven attempts and the first gold for his new club.

Other than last year when the Year 8 Edmond Rice High School student finished runner up, Scrivener has owned the flags.

He won against a much taller runner up, Liam Kelly from Fingal Beach, and says his size is an advantage. "Because I'm small I can get up quick."

On competing in the wind and driving rain he said, "It's hard. I don't like the rain; it gets in your eyes when you are running."

He acknowledged coach Daniel Robberds who he has worked with for the past four years.

Adam Newey's Under 14 beach sprint gold medal was a moving triumph for his parents, both of them in tears when their son out-ran his fellow finalists in the blur of pounding legs and flying sand.

Newey was also shocked by his top result. "I stopped nippers at Under 11 and came back because of Daniel. He's helped me start properly and worked on my stride."

The first person to jump the fence and congratulate Newey was Scrivener and before long the rest of the team had gathered to shake his hand. There was barely a dry eye among the crowd as emotions spilled over.

The Helensburgh beach team is tight and the camaraderie was obvious during every event.

Coach Robberds said, "We have a strong senior group and the young ones feed off their confidence.

"The younger ones feel part of the team and now their performance will inspire the whole group for next week's Open State title."

Robberds offers coaching outside Helensburgh Stanwell Park and Jazmine Yew from Thirroul SLSC is another of his

new underlings. She placed second and third in the past in flags and this time hit the zenith, seizing the best coloured medal of all in the Under 14 beach flags.

Young Jazmine was struggling with the cold and rainy conditions on Friday, the opening day of the carnival when the super coach delivered this inspirational gem. "I told her "there's nothing warmer than gold."

Towradgi's Sam Zustovich claimed his gold in Under 12 flags, his first ever gold medal and another that can be traced back to Robberds.

"I can't believe that I've actually won a NSW gold medal," said Zustovich. "I've been training so hard all year and now it's all been worth it. I'm honestly going to wear this medal all week!"

Another local winner was Sandon Point SLSC's Benjamin Hamill in the U13 boys beach flags.

Robberds' senior sand rats made history last year when they claimed gold in both the men's and women's open beach relay and women's open sprint final.

Starting next Friday Umina and Ocean beaches will again fill with tents and the sound of starting guns and cheering when the Central Coast hosts the third of four consecutive championship weekends, the NSW Open state title, March 7-9, 2014

As this was a host year all the previous committee were elected again with President Peter McDonald, Vice President Anne-Marie Connelly, Captain Barry McGuinness, Secretary Phil Kelly and Treasurer Terry Wood.

As this was our 25th year as a club, the Executive Committee had decided to host a special "Silver Eels Day" on Sunday 05 May 2013. We invited current members and all former Sea Eels members for whom we had contact details. In a truly memorable day, we started with a series of swims at the Coalcliff Pool, which revived the memories of many former Eels. Treasurers Report

This report covers all Club activities for the 12 months from 1 April 2013 to 31 March 2014.

MYOB software continues to be used to manage Club accounts and a single file covers "whole-of-Club" activities. The performance of individual sections is identifiable and monitored through the use of separate cost codes in the MYOB system, and Profit and Loss Reports for the main Club (senior section), Junior Activities, Winter Swimming section, and the Building Fund are included at the end of the Financial Statements.

All income and expenditure in Club financial reports are expressed as net amounts exclusive of GST. Amounts shown on this and the following page in parenthesis and in a smaller type font [\$1,623] are comparative results for the previous financial year.

Net income from donations and fund raising activities was \$45,577 [\$65,501]. Grants from the NSW Government (\$57,810) for building projects and equipment replacement, and Wollongong City Council (\$2,523) for patrol activities, are additional to this amount.

\$62,218 was expended on replacement of the southern windows of the Club building, and provision of storage facilities in the boat shed. The Club contributed \$10,703 to these works (the majority of which was paid in the previous financial year), and the State Government \$51,515.

Fundraising income and associated expenses were lower than the previous year with cancellation of the 2014 ocean swim

\$38,441 [\$35,624] was expended on asset replacements including an IRB, surf boat and trailer. Two racing skis for senior competitors and two nipper boards were acquired, and a storage cupboard was installed in the main hall. Value of Club assets at year end was assessed at \$136,488 [\$129,161].

Overall, the Club recorded a loss of \$1,436 [surplus \$1,623] for the year.

Club account (senior section)

A surplus of \$1,089 [deficit \$8,328] was recorded for the year.

At year end, the cash balance was a negative amount of \$3,566 [\$18,751]. Saleable stock (history book and bar stock) was valued at \$23,506 [\$3,180 for primarily bar stock].

Refreshment Trading

The bar was open for trading most Sundays between October and mid-March, and on Friday evenings until the end of April 2014.

Gross bar income increased to \$41,771 [\$36,989] and realised a net profit of \$17,563 [\$16,642]. Half of the profit was allocated to the Building Fund and the balance retained for general Club expenses.

Junior Section

Cash at year end was \$14,351 [\$15,059] with a deficit of \$539 [deficit \$1,877] recorded. Clothing stock was valued at \$13,681 [\$12,243].

\$1,568 was expended to purchase two training boards for nipper members.

Net income of \$3,478 [\$5,254] was realised from food sales associated with Sunday Junior Activity days and Friday evening sales, and a further \$909 from clothing sales.

Winter Swim section

Cash at year end was \$3,184 [\$1,313] with a surplus of \$1,344 [\$1,878] recorded. Clothing stock was valued at \$1,989 [\$684].

Building Fund

Cash balance at year end was \$114,427 [\$124,692].

\$13,658 [\$27,323] was added to the Fund during the year (bank interest and half bar profit). The 2014 ocean swim was cancelled, with a consequent reduction in income for the Building Fund.

\$2,366 was withdrawn to supplement State Government funding for building works and \$3,000 for supply and installation of a storage cupboard within the Club building.

A further \$18,557 was withdrawn and transferred to the Club bank account, as a temporary loan to pay for production of the Club History Book. At 30 June 2014, \$12,093 had been raised from history book sales and auctions, reducing the loan amount to \$6,464. Once the \$12,093 is transferred into the Building Fund, the balance will be \$126,520.

Annual Collection Day

The annual appeal day took place on Friday 1st November and Saturday 2nd November, with \$5,251 raised by members who "door-knocked" houses in Helensburgh, Stanwell Tops and Stanwell Park. Special thanks to all members who assisted, particularly our Junior members.

The generosity and support of local residents and shopkeepers who contributed to this appeal is acknowledged with thanks.





Financial Position

At 31 March 2014, the Club was not in debt to any supplier (other than within 30 day trading terms). At the date of this report, this statement is still valid.

Donations and fund raising

Donations received and income from fund raising activities are clearly identified in the accounts.

All donated funds were expended for the purpose for which they were sought, this being primarily for lifesaving and patrol operations, rescue equipment and education and training of members, other than for the following exceptions –

- donations to the Winter Swimming section which were specifically sought for CRAM House Foundation and other community related activities,
- donations associated with the hosting of fund raising events which in turn increased the net return to the Club, and
- donations which were specifically sought for competitive activities.

No member of the Club was entitled to or gained any personal benefits from any donations received.

GST reporting

Quarterly returns were submitted by the Public Officer during the year to the Australian Taxation Office. The September and December returns were not submitted by the due dates nominated by the ATO; however as rebates were due to the Club in both instances, the ATO did not impose penalties for late submission.

At 30 June 2014, the Club was not in debt to the ATO, and there were no outstanding GST reports.

Audit of Accounts

The Financial Statements attached were prepared by Harley Dreghorn after checking of MYOB entries against receipt books, payment vouchers, bank statements and other documentation. Following review and endorsement by the Management Committee, the Financial Statements and Club documentation were then submitted for audit by an independent auditor as required by the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991.

The audit was undertaken by Paul Mattock from Twelve Financial Pty Ltd; the Auditor's Report is included on pages 53 and 54.

Support in kind was received from Bob Goodwin of AccFin Services for auditing of Club accounts.

Stanwell Scramble

The Stanwell Scramble was not run this year. Scheduling issues hit the event last season and before we knew it season was well under way. The Scramble was an initiative of the boatie section to help in raising funds for competitors to be self sufficient. The Boaties will be looking to schedule a Stanwell Scramble for the upcoming 2014-15 season.

Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge

The 2014 Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge was unfortunately cancelled due to unfavourable surf conditions. Whilst surf reports were forecasting an expected increase in swell, the ocean swim committee were unsure of exactly when or how big the surf would be on Sunday 16th March.

The Ocean swim draws a large number of swimmers from across Sydney and the South Coast. Knowing that the surf was forecasted to increase significantly in size, and a large number of competitors were coming from across the region, the ocean swim committee wished to give competitors an early notification of any event cancellation if possible.

The Committee met at Stanwell Park inspecting both Stanwell park and Coalcliff beaches on the Saturday evening before hand with a view to cancel if they believed the event would not go ahead the next day. Committee members were greeted with reasonably tranquil conditions which would have yielded a successful event had the conditions held over into the Sunday.

Sunday saw morning at set up saw an increase on swell size to the previous Saturday evening with Coalcliff beach ruled out as a starting beach after organisers had completed their initial risk assessment. Organisers still

believed at this early stage that a modified event could be run at Stanwell Park beach.

Set up of the modified course continued for some time until it became evident that the swell was continuing to jack up and on the incoming tide was beginning to pose too greater risk to event participants. The Event was duly cancelled at this point.

The Management Committee at the time acknowledged the efforts of the ocean swim committee and its preparations for staging the 2014 Ocean Swim. Most pleasing was the way that the ocean swim event management plan was adhered to and worked the way it was intended with the decision on the day to cancel backed up by solid decision making process ultimately coming to the conclusion that it was unsafe to stage the event. Congratulations to all on the day involved in making the tough decision to cancel given the weeks of planning and effort expended to get swimmers in the water.

Big thanks to Ocean Swim committee convener Andrew Perrin and Harley Dreghorn for getting the event planned and approved. The process for approval is now much more involved than previous years and also makes it near impossible to postpone the event ultimately adding greater pressure on the decision to cancel on the day.

Governance

The Club's affairs continue to be controlled and managed by the Management Committee. The Committee is comprised 16 positions however with two positions not filled the committee consisted of only 14 members this year.

The Club Executive Committee had seven of eight positions filled, with decisions taken by the Executive confirmed at subsequent Management Committee meetings.

Various sub-committees existed to deal with specific functions, reporting to the Management Committee

Special General Meetings

A Special General Meeting was held on Saturday 30th March 2014 to elect the junior section committee and officers for 2014-15 season. The majority of Junior Activities Committee positions responsible for running the junior section were filled at this meeting with the other junior officer positions either filled at the SGM or to be appointed bay the JAC.

Executive Committee

Three meetings of the Executive Committee were held during the year to deal with matters that required urgent attention due to time constraints and could not be held over to the following Management Committee meeting.

The minutes of these meetings were subsequently tabled at Management Committee meetings.

Education Committee

A new requirement from NSW SLS required the Education section to meeting for at least 2 minuted meetings to discuss issues relating to awards and training.

A season kick off meeting was held at Chief Training Officer Bobo White's place to discuss the year ahead with regards to awards and proficiencies. The Education Committee then met as required to further discuss Proficiencies and awards/training in the club.

Subsequent minutes were tabled at the clubs Management Committee meetings and submitted to Illawarra Branch

Management Committee

Twelve Committee meetings were scheduled from July 2013 through to June 2014. On most occasions, there were enough Management Committee members present

to hold the meeting as a scheduled Management Committee.

The Management Committee continues to be the avenue for all members to have input into the operations of the club.

Junior Activities Sub-Committee

The Junior section (Seagulls) was controlled by the Junior Activities Committee which dealt with day to day matters autonomously and convening regular meetings through out the 2013-14 season.

The upcoming season 2014-15 has a fully elected Junior activities committee pumped and ready to go for the new season. Meetings are already underway with ideas to revamp the running of point score on Sundays and the focus returning to skills based in particular relating to surf education and surf confidence

Winter Swim Group (Stanwell Park Sea Eels)

The winter swimming group was controlled by the Stanwell Park Sea Eels sub-committee and dealt with day to day matters autonomously. The Sea Eels sub-committee was elected at a meeting of Club members and fellow members of Coalcliff SLSC and other surf clubs interested in and participating in winter swimming.

The Sea Eels continued to function as an autonomous committee on day to day matters.

Membership Management

Membership Fees

This year it was assessed the cost to the Club to operate as an incorporated association, and pay for insurance, building utility costs and membership levies (apportioned across 430 members) was \$36.69 per member.

Over the past few seasons, the auditing of the club accounts has been donated back to the club and therefore has kept per member costs lower than otherwise would have been the case. Account audit circumstances have changed and now require the club to pay for financial audit.

The budgeted cost to the Club to operate as an incorporated association, and pay for insurance, building utility costs and membership levies (apportioned across 400 members) was \$48.95 per member.

Membership fees for 2014-15 will therefore be raised by \$2 to the rate of \$60.00. A reduction of \$10.00 is available for members who renew their membership before the end of September

Collection of Membership Forms and Fees

The Registrar position for the club remained unfilled for season 2013-14. This made life difficult for the committee to carry out its normal functions using surf lifesaving databases and entry systems. A registrar for 2014-15 is a must to ensure that the club continues the upkeep of its membership databases.

Members are encouraged to renew online as this updates all surf lifesaving databases instantly ensuring that your membership is compatible with all other lifesaving online entry systems

Injuries to members

No members suffered injury during season 2013-14. No members sought re-imbursement for medical expenses under the NSW Workers Compensation (Bush Fire, Emergency and Rescue Services) Act 1987

Welfare of Members - Member Protection Policy

Similar to other organisations where people work with children, Surf Life Saving requires members to complete a "volunteer/student declaration" as part of the NSW Government's "Working with Children Check" program.

Members now only require to complete the form once, rather than annually with the date of completion recorded on the members history in Surfguard.

The Club's Child Protection Co-ordinator for 2013-14 was Ed White, Secretary.

Competition Levy

At the end of season 2011-12, the outgoing committee looked in detail at the clubs finances and found that and a large chunk of funds was being spent on competition. This remains the case in season 2013-14

The rate of the competition levy remained at \$100 for over 19 year olds and \$30 for those U19. Unfortunately the invoices for the competition levy were only sent out to competitors late June 2014 well after the season had past. The committee acknowledges that this is an inefficient process and intends to send out invoices to known competitors prior to the first carnival.

The competition levy will be continually reviewed each season as to its effectiveness and comparison made against its stated outcomes.

Publicity

Regular reports were provided by Beach Events Coordinator Daniel Robberds and Boat Captain Mark Lea to the local publications. Daniel and Mark provided competition updates for all our athletes over the course of the 2013-14 season. Karl Weber as the club's publicity officer provided other reports to the local publications for the non competition articles.

Information was sent to local, Wollongong and Sydney newspapers about the Stanwell Park Ocean Challenge and the launch of the 100 year history book.

Opportunity was taken to utilise the Helensburgh community sign at the end of Parkes Street to advantage, with promotion of registration days, Lifesavers Appeal Day and Ocean Challenge.

The website was maintained by Steven McDonald and used to keep members informed of Club activities, promote major events, advise results of major surf carnivals, as well as promoting the Ocean Swim and other community events.

Surfguard Email and SMS

Communications appear to work reasonably well through surfguard but must not be used at the exclusion of other communication medium.

It is envisioned by the club committee that email, SMS, website, hardcopy post, local news articles and advertisement been used together to provide the greatest chance of reaching our intended audience.

Towards the end of season, paper based snail mail made a return to the suite of communication avenues. A number of bigger events were promoted this way to try and circumvent the "Junk Mail" filter of email.

Website

The Website this season provided a lot more value than seasons past. Under the direction of club president Steve McDonald, the website now includes a number of added features including rsvp functions for club events, published club policies, and hire information.

The website will continue to undergo organic development into the upcoming season as required.

CRAM House Foundation

Stanwell Park Sea Eels again hosted the intellectually disabled young people from CRAM House in Wollongong to a day out at Helensburgh Workers Club during August. Supporting these young people has been on-going commitment of the Sea Eels since 1998.



Club Building

NSW Surf Club Building Infrastructure Grant 2011-12

In 2011-12 the club was successful in its application for grant funding through the Surf Club Building Infrastructure grant totalling \$39,196 in quoted project works of which the grant will fund \$29,390. The grant was to complete cement rendering of the surf club main hall, install a cage and mezzanine storage structures in the boat shed, and the installation of a new security system for the surf club building

Both the cement rendering of the surf club main hall, installation of a cage, and installation of mezzanine storage in the boat shed were completed in either season 2012-13 or early in season 2013-14

The installation of the electronic security system was completed in 2013-14 prior to last years Annual General Meeting. Unfortunately the system continues to be plagued by problems relating to the type of locks installed and the stability of the system itself. At all times the building has remained secure during times of system instability.

The issue of security system stability and other associated problems is being pursued with council.

NSW Surf Club Building Infrastructure Grant 2012-13

The committee again submitted a grant application for the 2012-13 NSW Surf Club Building Infrastructure grant and was again successful. The club again applied for 3 sub projects in one application with the installation of bi-fold windows, rooftop access to the council storage at the western end and emergency egress/disabled access also at the western end of the building.

The club was successful in funding for only one of the three sub projects with emergency egress/disabled access and rooftop access excluded from funding due to incomplete quotations and scope of works.

The south facing window bays with the exception of the patrol room have recently been replaced with bi-fold windows and 1.2m glass window panels underneath. This work was completed mid May 2013. The general comments from members throughout season 2013-14 have been really positive. The club is now reaping the

rewards of the increased funding on amenities with more interest in surf club hall hire being received since the works have been completed.

Council Works

Council continue to work with our club committee to progressively address all the maintenance and building issues that currently reside with our building structure. Notable council works are included below

In season 2013-14, council replaced the upstairs windows which was the major source of water ingress into the surf club main hall. This should adequately seal the building from water damage in future storm events.

Future Building Works

The club was dealt an early setback at the beginning of season 2013-14 with regards to future building projects. Council deemed that any work within the clubs 3 year goal window that required a DA would trigger the need to update all club amenities to meet the standards and codes of today. This means significant outlay of funds in remediation works well above the initial capital spend required to achieve primary desired outcomes.

The rooftop access is one such project which triggers a DA and therefore turns a project worth approx \$15,000 into significant multiples above the initial quote. The club committee placed future building requirements on the back burner to address more pressing issues as the committee had to blood new members in key committee positions.

Season 2014-15 hopefully should see a return to focus on building amenities and keep the dream of producing a holistic building plan within the 3 years from 2012-13 alive.

Education

Education had a better season than what the table below represents. Season 2012-13 saw a large number of awards due to the updating of surfguard to better reflect the true state of the awards members had gained over the years. The number of red crosses most probably reflects overly ambitious targets as the club has reverted back to normal award numbers this season.

There are however a number of pleasing results from the education team. 17 SRC awards is a great achievement as

too is the 10 ARTC awards for season 2013-14. Bronze Medallions were down with 7 less bronze recipients compared to last year. IRB drivers and IRB crewies would be an area to target for season 2014-15.

Congratulations to all those involved in the education of club members throughout the club on your efforts during season 2013-14. A Big year for all resulting in the entire Education Team being named Illawarra Team of the year! An outstanding effort.

Future Direction Goals and Targets

A number of Goals and Targets were set out by the outgoing committee at the end of season 2012-13 to be achieved in the 2013-14 season. The 'Actual' column is the absolute number measured for the season, the 'YoY Change' column gives a representation of a comparison of absolute numbers when compared to the previous season, and the 'Result column is the 'Actual' measured value as a percentage of the Target value.

As a whole the club had a good season. Admittedly when the committee of 2012-13 sat down to produce some strategic targets, the targets set were not based on anything but pure instinct and as such the committee of 2013-14 hit approx 35% of targets with 23% of targets not having enough information to determine the outcome at the time of print. Not a bad effort in all.

Another flaw in the process was that the outgoing committee set the targets for the incoming committee which may have an entirely different idea of what targets are suitable and reasonable for the upcoming season. This will be amended for season 2014-15 with the incoming committee and sub committees to meet in late July or early August to discuss the targets and goals for 2014-15 and how we wish to track and report progress on achieving these goals.

Whilst the outlaying of strategic goals is important for organisational success, our membership must remember that each committee member is here to contribute as a volunteer and targets out comes should be treated with respect to this fact. If a target is missed, then so be it. Targets provide a means to show improvement and progress to our membership and provide insight into areas where we believe improvement is needed.

Junior section committee did a great job with a large number of new people involved at the committee level. A healthy increase in membership was recorded though the increase in junior membership did miss its ambitious intended target. No information as to how many surf awareness awards were received by the junior membership and should remain a key focus for the junior committee

Sea Eels

It is pleasing to see that the club is still pushing for the inclusion of women at all winter swimming associations in the south coast. The Sea Eels should be congratulated on their persistent stance on this issue very much promoting an inclusive family club.

Club Communication and Management

Unfortunately the club only set out 2 Park Benches in 2013-14. This was mostly due to the committee not providing content for Publicity Officer Karl Weber to compile and send out. The website was used extensively throughout the season and worked quite well as a communication medium when complemented with surfguard broadcasts.

The Executive remained visible to the membership as a whole providing several access points to voice concerns or give feed back. Commendably, 6 of the 7 executives still actively patrol the beach. An area where visibility maybe improved is cross-pollination away from sections that the executives normally associate with, that is, if an executive does not have much to do with the juniors then they could go down one point score and make the face known.

More could be done to encourage females to take on committee positions as representation at the committee level would be beneficial to club decision making.

Competition

The clubs competitors had an outstanding season on the sand and in the water. The club was 7th at the Open State Titles and placed high in the Age State Titles. The club also came 16th at the Australian Titles beating a number of much bigger clubs and finishing the highest out of all the Illawarra Clubs

Statutory Information

Annual Statement for Incorporated Associations

The Annual Statement for 2012-13 financial year, as required by the *Associations Incorporations Act* 1984 was submitted to the Office of Fair Trading in August 2013.

Financial Reporting

As required by the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, the Club is required to submit an audited financial report covering the whole of Club operations each year. A summary of the 2013-14 Financial Report is included elsewhere in this report.

Compliance with SLS NSW requirements

The Financial Report for 2012-13 was submitted to Surf Life Saving NSW together with Application for Affiliation for 2013-14 in August 2013.

At the date of this report, the Club Executive believes that all documentation and other matters required by SLSNSW have been completed.

Liquor Licence

On 29 July 2012 the Club applied to the Office of Liquor Gaming and Racing for an On-Premises Licence together with a detailed Venue Management Plan.

This application is to allow sale and consumption of alcohol at any time between 10.00am and 10.00pm Sundays to Thursdays, and up to 12 midnight on Fridays and Saturdays was submitted to OLGR, restricting sale and consumption of alcohol to the area within the building.

On 13 September 2012, OLGR cancelled the Function Licence that had been in place since 1991, and issued a new On-Premises Licence for Stanwell Park Surf Club, with Michael Dent appointed as the Manager of the Licence – Licence LIQO 660031060.

No incidents relating to the Liquor Licence were recorded during the year.

Health and Safety

No inspection has been done so far this year.

Environmental management

Refuelling of IRBs and the quad bike within the boat shed and paved outdoor area is the predominant environmental risk. Similar to previous years, the risk continued to be mitigated by the availability of a spill kit located in the boat shed, and briefing of IRB crews and patrol members on their duty of care when refuelling.

Food business notification

Notification and registration of the Club as the operator of a food business (dispensing of drinks and preparation and sale of food items) was forwarded to the NSW Food Authority in October 2004 and is still current.

Asset Register

The Asset Register was maintained on a computer database and updated to reflect changes over the last 12 months. Rescue and competition assets are also recorded on Surfguard.

Values were established for all Club assets for insurance purposes, and for inclusion of asset values in the financial accounts.

A summary of the Asset Register is included at the end of this report

Insurance

Insurance policies covering fire and burglary of Club property and equipment within the Surf Club, as well as policies for theft and damage to the IRBs and surf boats, and motor vehicle insurance for the ATV, boat trailers and board trailer were maintained. All insurance was affected through brokers Jardine Lloyd Thompson Pty Ltd who manage insurance for most other surf clubs.

Public liability insurance to an amount of \$20M was effected through a policy maintained by SLS NSW, the cost being covered in part by the membership levy contribution of \$14.36 (excl GST) per member payable to SLS NSW.

Directors and Officers Insurance was effected through a policy also maintained by SLS NSW at a cost of \$420.00 (excl GST).

Members continue to be covered for medical expenses incurred as a result of an injury whilst involved in an approved surf club activity through the NSW government scheme for volunteer workers. Members who become incapacitated and unfit for work as a result of an injury, are also re-imbursed for loss of wages for a limited period.

Notes to the Financial Statements

The Financial Report covers all operations and activities of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club Inc including subgroups, as an individual entity.

Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in NSW under the *Associations Incorporations Act* 2009.

1 Basis of Preparation

The Financial Report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 2009, and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and Regulations under those Acts.

The Financial Report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs, modified where applicable by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets, and financial liabilities.

Income Tax

The Association is exempt from Income Tax under Division 51, Section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

The Association does not own any real property.

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

2 Financial Instruments

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office.

GST recoverable (\$4,338) from the Australian Tax Office for period 1 January 2014 to 31 March 2014 is included in the accounts as a Current Liability.

Comparative Figures

This report is for the 12 month period commencing 1 April 2013 and ending 31 March 2014, with comparative figures for the 12 months ended 31 March 2013.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF HELENSBURGH-STANWELL PARK SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC

Scope

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the period ending 31 March 2014. The Club's Management Committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the Associations Incorporations Act 1987.
