ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET FOR SEASON 1950 - 1951.

The Committee of the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Surf Life Saving Club has pleasure in presenting for your adoption the Annual Report, together with duly audited Balance Sheet for the season ended 30th June, 1951.

Patrols were maintained on Sundays and Holidays throughout the Season. At the commencement of the season it was hoped that a general improvement would be evident in the conduct of patrols, however, as the season progressed it was disappointing to find that a general falling of of interest was noticeable, and a high degree of absenteeism resulted in a lessening of all round efficiency. It is hoped that the season ahead will see an improvement in respect to patrols, around which all club activities must function.

RESCUES.

The following rescues were recorded;-

With line. . . . 20 Without line. . . 12.

Three of the above required resuscitation and recovered. There were no fatalities during the season.

FIRST AID.

Three hundred and thirty one (331) cases were recorded as being treated for various accidents, blue bottle stings, etc. Several cases requiring additional hospital treatment. These cases were capably handled by Messrs. Tom Cannon and Bert Smith.

MIMBIRSHIP.

The Club has an Active membership of 62, and a total

membership of 144.

A substantial increase is greatly desired in the club active membership, and an appeal is made to the older members from the Helensburgh District to stimulate interest in the Club amongst the younger people in the town.

It was found necessary to suspend 6 members for absenteeism from patrols, and to reprimand 3 others.

Your Committee has met regularly and as required throu -ghout the year. These meetings were not always well attended. The Club was represented by its own delegates at most Branch Meetings.
