GENTLEMEN.

The Committee of the Helensburgh-Stanwell Park S.L. S.C. has pleasure in presenting for your consideration the Annual Report for the Season, 1951-1952, ending June 30th, 1952.

PATROLS.

Patrols were maintained on Sundays and Holidays, throughout the Season, a general improvement being evident in this dapartment, compared to the previous season. This is no doubt due in some measure to the spirit engendered by the Captain Wehb Cup. It is hoped that a further improvement will be seen in the coming Season.

RESCUES.

The following rescues were recorded, With Line.... 15.
Without Line... 7.

Three of the above required resuscitation and recovered. There were no fatalities in the surf, it is regretted, however, that I life was lost in the lagoon.

FIRST AID.

Two hundred and ninety eight (298) cases were recorded as being treated for various accidents, blue bottle stings, etc. Several cases required additional hospital treatment. These cases were capably handled by Messrs. Cannon and Smith.

MEMBERSHIP.

The Club has an active membership of 56, and a total membership of 148. A substantial increase is desired in the active membership, a further appeal being made to the members from the Helensburgh District to stimulate interest in the Club.

METTINGS.

Your Committee has met regularly and as required throughout the year. These meetings were not always well attended, a falling off being most noticeable towards the end of the Season. The Club was represented at all Branch Meetings by its own delegates.

OBITUARY. It is with regret that we record the death of Mr.J. Turnoch, and our deepest sympathy is extended to the relatives.
