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Gentlemen,

Again I have pleasure in presenting for your consideration this, our 38th, Annual Report. Last year when your Report prophesised that we were headed for a bright season provided Members generally pulled their weight, it is doubted if the tremendous success achieved was envisaged, and now we can look forward to an even brighter future, again, of course, provided that full co-operation is continued.

Rescues, Patrols and First Aid

Patrols generally were quite satisfactory, but regrettably towards the end of the season some members became lax.

Our high reputation for excellent patrols requires a rectifying of this attitude. Happily it can again be reported that no lives were lost on our beach, though our Members were called upon to recover two bodies - one which had washed in from an accident elsewhere, and one due to a cliff fall. On each occasion our Members proved most efficient.

Though the total number of rescues increased to 47, this was no reflection on the keenness of patrols, rather did it indicate that our beach was better patronised than in recent seasons. Most of the rescues were of a minor nature, that is if the saving of a life can be considered as minor. Of the rescues 19 were made with line and bolt, 3 by boat and 20 without gear. None of those rescued required resuscitation.

First aid treatments registered were fewer at 101.

Carnivals and Competitions

It is safe to say that in the entire history of our Club we have never been more successful than in the season under review. Bill Phillips won several Junior Surf Races including the Branch Championship, and finished a very close second in the State Championship thus qualifying for a start in the Australian title in which he was unplaced, and also he was a member of the successful Illawarra Branch team.

John Pringolf won numerous Junior Belt races and finished a very close second in the Branch Championship, he was first home in the Junior Team Championship which we also won, the team being John Pringolf, Craig Burke, Mark Jury and Bill Phillips. Mark Jury was also successful in a belt race, won his novice and was placed in Junior Surf and Pelt Races. Craig Burke and Bill Phillips also gained wins in Novice Surf races. The above four plus Ross Birrell and Bob Patt competed regularly in Rescue and Resuscitation events, and showed considerable improvement thanks to their own efforts and to the coaching of Tom Corbett - again thanks a lot Tom. Is all these members will still be Juniors in the coming season we can look forward to even better results.

In craft events Lance Norton and Ryan Phillips finished second in a disputed decision in the French Double Ski Championship. During the season they had a win and several placings in double ski races. Lance was also a force to be reckoned with in single ski events being regularly placed and gained a very creditable third in the Branch titles.

A second placing was also obtained in the French Cadet Beach Holiday Championship, the team being Paul Lucas, Robert Sams, Rob Pugh and Michael Billings.

Regrettably participation by "Seagull" members was not up to the standard of previous years, and this is no reflection on the efforts of their Instructor. Actually the interest of Club members generally in the "Seagulls" was not so evident as formerly, and this state of affairs should be remedied for the good of all of us.

The Club was represented at all Branch Carnivals, at the State Championships at Coogee and by Bill Phillips at the Australian titles in Perth. Our own carnival got off to a good start, then swimming events had to be cancelled due to the presence of uninvited guests (sharks).

The surf boat competed at only a couple of carnivals, and the continued offer of free petrol for transport by Mr Kingston was much appreciated.

An appeal was conducted to finance the expenses of our sole representative at the Australian Championships, and even though the next National titles will be held much closer to home (Queensland) it behoves the Club to concern itself about the expenses of likely qualifiers to these titles, especially as it is hoped that a number of our Juniors will qualify.

Finance

Clubhouse and Gear

Gear generally was reasonably well maintained. Council did some maintenance on a couple of their reels but several need repainting, likewise the new surf boat is overdue for a coat of varnish.

As previously recorded gear has been increased by the new stainless steel reel, line and belt won in the B.P Competition, and further by another such reel received from the NSW State Centre of the Association from a donation given by an anonymous donor.

The ceiling of the Meeting Room has at last been painted but still the ceiling of the main hall has received no attention even though the last Annual Report drew attention to the fact that

paint has been on hand for some time.

Soon after the start of last season the Wollongong Council completed the extension of the Tear and Observation Room (paid for by our share of Parking Fees.) These additions have proved most beneficial.

Just after Master Wollongong Council's order requiring the demolition of all buildings on the Camping Area became effective, and together with all other structures our own First Aid Cabin had to be demolished. This was cavalier treatment from the Council which in the first instance gave written permission for the erection of the cabin, but it would entertain no approach from representatives of our Club to discuss its retention. Besides the First Aid Cabin the weekenders of a number of members also had to be demolished and this of course will have effect on our future membership, and this also did not seem to interest the Council.

Thanks again to all Members who fulfilled their obligations, to local businessmen for their continued support, to Tony Bevan and the Aerial Patrol Service, to the Stanwell Park Local Committee, to the Illawarra Branch, to our District Supervisor (Ken Corbett), and to all supporters for assistance given.

Congratulations to those members who have participated in various winter sports and for any success achieved, and congratulations also to "Stanwell Park Surfers" girls Basketball team for their magnificent win in the Illawarra competition.

Finally it is imperative that stress be laid on the necessity to retain our present membership and to increase it by recruiting additional members to train for their awards. Also it is requested that members make themselves available for positions of which they are capable of fulfilling, thus easing the load on your officers.
