SEAGULLS REPORT - 1973-74

Again we can boast of another very successful season and our boys seem to be getting stronger every year.

Congratulations to Graham Mercer and Brett Mitchell, two of our members who have been selected to represent New South Wales at the interstate carnival to be held at Mooney, South Australia next season. Graham was selected for his great win in the beach flags in the State titles season, and Brett for his fine fourth in the surf swim.

The State titles were a great success for us. Besides Graham's win and Brett's fourth, Warwick Giddey was 2nd in the 5 years wade, K. Giddey was 3rd in 7 years wade, 11 years chariot team won and 13 years chariots won for the second year in succession, while the march past team came fifth. Congratulations to the boys for a fine effort.

With 6 Illawarra carnivals contested, we gained 98 firsts, 99 seconds, 95 thirds. In the branch championships the boys were placed 2nd in the overall point-score, beaten by one point by Wollongong, with 14 firsts, 20 seconds and 8 thirds.

Ten juveniles gained their Qualifying Certificates last season, giving the senior club a total of 14 (and possibly more) cadets for the start of the coming season. I now ask the senior members of the club to take a keener interest in the cadets, encourage them whenever possible and help them to become keen club members. They have always been keen as juveniles and can help put this club up near the top and carry on the good name that it has had in past years, but only with guidance and help from experienced members.
