This is due to the fact that the members were forgetting or could not be bothered to get "fill ins" or substitutes to take their place. Competition within the club was a very big success mainly due to our Competition Organiser, Mark Thompson. It was Mark's maiden year in this position and he came through with flying colours. A very big thanks goes to Mark.

Carnival competition was a big success as far as the club was concerned, winning 8 Gold Medals at the Illawarra Branch Championships. Congratulations to our three Branch Champions, Marina Wood (the first Lady Branch Champion in the club), Kevin Morton (who was also chosen as Tooheys Man of the Carnival), and Graham Mercer, who later went on to become our new World Champion.

A very big congratulation on behalf of the club to Graham Mercer on winning the World Beach Flags title and also our Club Member of the Year award.

I would like to thank all the members who were involved in the running of the very successful Illawarra Branch Championships; that's another event the 'Park' can be proud of.

In our 75th Anniversary Year, the club boasted with 76 active patrol members, making us one of the biggest active memberships in our Branch.

Finally a special thanks to my Vice Captain, Paul Potter on the 100 percent effort he gave me and the patrols throughout the season. The club would only half function without blokes like Paul.

That concludes the 1982/83 season and our 75th Anniversary Year. I am sure that we can all say it was a memorable one, and one in which I was proud to be the Captain of Helensburgh-Stanwell Park S.L.S.C. My sincere thanks to all club members for all the effort and support you have shown me in this season.

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed this season with either six or seven members in each. As the season progressed and new members gained their Qualifying Certificate or Bronze Medallion, the patrols were built up with extra members to eight or nine in each.

A roving patrol was formed this season for the first time, to give members with difficult work commitments an opportunity to do patrols on days that did not interfere with their jobs.

It is interesting to consider the cost to the community and/or the taxpayer, if our patrol members did not give their time freely. For example each patrol was rostered for either eight or nine Sundays patrols, and generally one Saturday patrol, i.e. each member was asked to give 36 hours of his time.

The average hourly rate of pay on a weekend is now about \$8.00, and with each of our 76 active members giving 36 hours you can easily see the cost (or if you cannot, a calculator will tell you its something like \$22,000.00 over six months).

Wollongong City Council again approved the appointment of 15 club members as Honorary Beach Inspectors. These members were the nine patrol captains, plus the Club Captain, Vice Captain, President, I.R.B. Vice Captain, Chief Instructor, and Bobo White.

Throughout the season, a total of 89 rescues were performed, nearly half of these with the aid of the I.R.B.

1500 people were warned throughout the season to swim within the flags, or clear of danger areas.

There were no persons requiring resuscitation.

113 incidents of people requiring treatment for marine animal stings (mainly blue bottles) and eight cases of minor first aid, were recorded.

Again, the club and its members can proudly acclaim No Lives Lost on Stanwell Park beach during club patrol hours.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

New life saving equipment obtained during the year included an I.R.B., purchased on a \$ for \$ Gear Grant from the Australian Government. The boat was delivered just prior to the end of the year, and will be used for the first time next season.

A new I.R.B. motor was ordered and will be delivered prior to the start of the next season.

The old I.R.B. (five seasons old) is currently for sale.

The old I.R.B. motor (two seasons old) has been sold.

A new reel, line and belt was donated to the Club by the Helensburgh Lions Club early in the season. This reel is intended purely for use in march past events, and is thought to be the first polished timber reel owned by the club.

At the end of the year, the oared surf boat 'Con Asmussen' was undergoing repairs and was expected to be available for competitive use again next season.

A new base radio unit and two portable radios were obtained during the year to replace the equipment stolen during the previous season. These radios were purchased with the aid of the \$ for \$ Grant from the Australian Government.

New carnival equipment to the value of approximately \$200.00 was acquired and used for the first time at the Illawarra Branch Championships on 6th February 1983. The club now possesses a complete set of carnival gear in excellent condition. Some of the equipment, such as R. & R., and beach marker flags, arena posts, was reclaimed from the 1958 State Titles held at Stanwell Park, and rejuvenated with a coat of paint.

At the end of the season, club equipment was valued at approximately \$7,000.00. However, replacement of the I.R.B. and motor will increase this figure by about \$4,000.00.

All life saving equipment has been maintained in a satisfactory condition throughout the season, and except for some weekends when the 1.R.B. was out of service for repair, all equipment was immediately available if required for an emergency.

DISTRICT SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

The 1982-83 season was a very successful one for Helensburgh – Stanwell Park in the area of awards, and much credit must go to all the instructors who put squads through, under the guidance of Michael Keating.

Another member who must get a big mention is Mark Ryan. Mark has got the 'Rubber Duckie' function into a real life saving unit. In previous years, the 'Rubber Duckie' has not been correctly maintained in such an efficient manner. Nor have there been any I.R.B. awards trained for, and gained, in previous years.

Attendance of patrols has improved slightly but I think the standard of the patrols has deteriorated. The general attitude is often very slack and it is usually the persons who have not the energy to put their hats on correctly, are the worst.

In conclusion, I would like to congratulate the more mature members who attempted the Run-swim-run, especially Scratch, Des and Clive. Remember a fit life saver is a safe life saver.

Following severe damage to the roof of the old building by a storm late in February 1983, Wollongong City Council decided that the cost of repairs would be uneconomical and sought the Club's approval to demolish the building. As there was a definite indication that a start was to be made on the 2nd stage, the Building Committee agreed and the old building was unceremoniously bulldozed to the ground on 6th June, 1983.

As most members are aware, the second stage will provide a hall, radio room, office, kitchen and amenities, and a bunk house. At present there is no indication of a completion date.

SECRETARY'S REPORT – CLUB ADMINISTRATION

Considerable difficulty was again experienced in having sufficient committee members present to form a quorum, and it was necessary to cancel the first monthly meeting, and deal only with urgent business at the second. When you look at the list of members holding official positions in the club, see inside front cover, it will be seen that there are over 30 different members. It is difficult to understand why we cannot get a quorum of seven.

Two special general meetings have been held during the year, the first on 31st October 1982 being arranged to determine what the members wanted to do regarding committee meetings. At that meeting, it was decided that the Executive would continue to run the club, within the terms of the Constitution, and that committee meetings or general meetings would only be convened if required.

Whilst this decision has made it somewhat easier for Terry Daintry, Geoff Wood and myself, and the other executive members in not having to arrange and attend formal committee meetings once a month, it does not provide you the members, with the opportunity of attending a meeting and raising matters of concern to you. We believe it is not good for club administration and we know it has led to suggestions being made that the club has sometimes been run the way the Executive want, not the way the members want.

If you are nominated and accept a position next season, bear in mind that you are elected by other members as their representative, and it is your responsibility to represent them throughout the whole year, and particularly at committee and other meetings.

Again, the funding situation has been critical, although the \$2,000.00 Australian Government Grant for the purchase of equipment has been well received, and has in the main enabled us to renew the I.R.B. after five years of service.

The major drain on our finances over the past few years has been the need to provide a proportion towards the cost of construction of the new club building. We have already paid out \$10,000 for the first stage and Council is now looking for a further \$5,000 towards the second stage. Our building account now stands at \$2,940.00.

On top of this the Club has expended considerable small amounts on miscellaneous items, such as new keys, interior fittings and so on, and these small things can be expected for another couple of years whilst the new club house is fitted out.

Those of you who have attended the seminars will be aware of suggestions made to formulate a finance budget on which the club would run throughout the year. Whilst the Executive agree with the idea of a budget, it is not really feasible to work to a budget when funds are scarce, and many unknown and unbudgetted amounts for Fun Runs, etc. are incurred. It would seem necessary that this be left over till the next season. Other recommendations of the seminars have included the documenting of job descriptions, i.e. listing all the duties of the various official positions in the club. This is now being progressed, and it is hoped to have most of them available before the Annual General Meeting.

A further recommendation was a proposal to split the club into three groups that would operate separately to each other, but which would be pulled together through the club executive. Basically, the groups are Life Saving Committee, the Competition Committee and the Social Committee. A group of club members has already met and formulated an outline of the membership and functions of each committee

It is proposed that the recommendations be discussed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, and if agreeable, the proposals will be introduced immediately with the election of office bearers for 1983/84 proceeding on the new arrangements.

Continuing liaison has been arranged with the Junior Club, the Seagulls, through the club being represented at Seagulls committee meetings, and vice versa. Invitations have been extended on a number of occasions, and accepted, for the Seagulls to become involved in club social activities.

Discussions are currently taking place with the executive of the Seagulls in regard to the formulation of a Constitution for that club. Basically, it is intended the Club Constitution will cover the Seagulls with some minor amendments to cover their specific requirements.

Water safety has been provided as required for the Seagulls Sunday morning competitions, and a commitment has been made to provide water safety for the Illawarra Branch Junior Championships which the Seagulls will host in 1983/84.

The Seagulls in return have provided the club with much manpower/childpower with assistance on Lifesavers Appeal Day, the Burgh to Beach Fun Run and the Illawarra Branch Championships. Special mention must be made of the assistance over many years given by Evan Griffiths, and in more recent times by Seagulls President, Mick Dezius.

The Seagulls will be celebrating their 25th Anniversary Year next season, and I am sure all members of the club would wish them well for the future.

The club's association with the Illawarra Branch has been maintained on a satisfactory basis, and the club has been represented by its elected delegates at all meetings.

Two club members now hold office with the Illawarra Branch, viz Terry Daintry as a Vice President, and Bobo White has continued his involvement as a District Supervisor. Once again, your Annual Report has been brought to you in book form, and it is intended this will be continued in future years. The Steering Committee co-opted the services of several members for special projects. Among these was Jim Thorn who was entrusted with the compilation of the history book. Jeff Lucke undertook to control the T Shirt project and to act as treasurer for the committee. The planning of the Dinner Dance was left in the hands of 'Bobo' White and his sub-committee. Despite the problems enumerated the publication was a very worthwhile history, well received generally, and Jim Thorn is to be congratulated for his time consuming efforts.

The book is still for sale at \$3 per copy. The price has been kept so low because of donations received at the 'Old Boys' Reunion, and further donations generated by Ken Bridle. Also cover messages by the Helensburgh Workmens Club and by the Wollongong City Council assisted financially.

The 'Burgh to Beach' Fun Run sponsored by the United Permanent Building Society and so capably planned by Terry Daintry, proved a real winner in all respects – it is hoped that it can be made an annual event.

After much planning the club was granted the staging of the Illawarra Branch Surf Life Saving Championships and it is felt that a new standard has been set for the presentation of future such titles. The assistance of past and present members under the guidance of club President Terry Daintry, Captain Geoff Wood and Vice Captain Paul Potter, laid the foundations for a good carnival and our competitors put the icing on a well planned and well run championship carnival by winning a 'swag' of medals.

It was expected the dinner dance would be the big event of the year as far as organisation was concerned and indeed this proved to be the case. After much planning the function proved most successful and it was good to see the wonderful response eventually. The sub-committee who handled the final arrangements are sincerely congratulated.

Souvenirs for the 'Year' were arranged and will be available till stocks run out. The 'T Shirts', (and there are several designs) are in the very capable hands of Jeff Lucke. The history book and the souvenir glasses can be obtained from any member of the Steering Committee, and as this report is being prepared there are very few bottles of souvenir labelled 'stagger juice' left and these are available to early purchasers from Bobo White.

As was done in our 50th year a pine tree was planted to recognise our 75th year. This was done by our first Lady Bronze Medallion holder – Tanya Lean, on the morning after the dinner dance, and the donation of the tree by Bob Glasson is appreciated.

As final recognition of our 75th year it was decided to name the newly acquired Inshore Rescue Boat in honour of that year - so its name will be '75th Year' and hopefully it will be as successful as the year under review.

May I express my appreciation to my fellow committeemen, both those elected and co-opted, and to all the many people who helped make the 'Year' as successful as it was.


