PRESIDENTS REPORT

It would be great to be able to record that everything went highly satisfactorily in the season under review. Actually in some areas, things went great. Some patrols were really good, and generally patrols showed an improvement over previous seasons; however, some patrols and patrol members could have performed much better.

Some elected officers were heavily overworked and had to cover sections for which other people were really responsible. In this respect the assistance of some volunteers was greatly appreciated.

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Carnivals were not well attended most of the time, however those who did attend regularly fared well, and on the few occasions that the Club was well represented good results were obtained.

Club functions such as the Fun Run, the Annual Carnival, etc. were well presented thanks again to the few willing members who did assist. Collection Day could have shown a much better result had more members turned up and shown the same drive as those who did assist.

The building of the new club house gained a new lease of life with a much appreciated grant of \$10,000.00 from the New South Wales Government through the N.S.W. State Centre of S.L.S.A. and our sincere appreciation is expressed for this. Our appreciation is also extended to Wollongong City Council for its involvement with the new building.

Thanks also to the Illawarra Branch S.L.S.A. and its Board of Examiners and to all other supporters and well wishers, and especially must I say thanks to those members who have assisted with the new stage of the club house building.

The Junior Section of the Club, the Seagulls and Seagalls, as usual was well run by a very energetic set of officials.

To those officers and members who helped shoulder the load of running the Club, I convey my appreciation, however I feel the club must apply itself to operating as a Club of the 80's as in many instances this is not the case at present.

Having said all that may I implore all members to start thinking along the following lines -

LIFE SAVING AND PATROLS

Nine patrols were formed again this season, with six or seven members in each. Roving patrols were continued for those members who had difficulties maintaining regular rostered patrols.

Wollongong City Council again appointed club members as Honorary Beach Inspectors for the season. These included the Club Captain and other officers, plus the nine patrol captains.

Throughout the season, which was a long one with a late Easter, a total of 48 rescues were performed. The I.R.B. featured in 8 of these, with most others being performed with rescue boards.

There were no persons requiring resuscitation; 41 people were treated for stings, etc., and 11 people were given first aid treatment.

During the year it was necessary to revamp one patrol whose members were regularly failing to fulfil their patrol obligations. Appropriate action was taken by the Committee with the defaulting members.

Again, a safe season with no lives lost.

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CLUB EQUIPMENT

Although application was made for a Commonwealth Government \$ for \$ gear grant, the club was not successful this season.

During the year, repairs to the Con Assmussen were completed and the boat has been returned to the Club. However, the lack of serviceable oars has prevented the boat being used for competition this season.

A new I.R.B. motor was acquired this season, and efforts have been made to dispose of the old I.R.B., the Alex McKenzie. Up to the end of the year, these have been unsuccessful. The old I.R.B. motor was sold during the year.

A new rescue board was won by the Club in an Illawarra Branch competition during 1982/83 for the club with the most awards gained in relation to the number of members in the club.

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Club radios and other small items of equipment were stolen when the club was broken into in January, 1984. These items have since been replaced through insurance.

A new I.R.B. trailer is being obtained and will be available before the start of the season.

Certain club equipment, particularly competition craft and rescue boards, has been subject to mis-use during the year. Action has been taken to place stricter controls on the use of all club equipment.

At the end of the season, it was estimated that club equipment was valued at approximately \$15,000.00.

Two special General Meetings were convened during the year. The first on 2nd October 1983, was to elect a new President, following the resignation of Terry Daintry due to other commitments.

The general administrative function of the club has improved during the year with more active involvement of elected office bearers in running their own specific area.

Public relations have been improved during the year by regular reporting in the Wollongong Northern News.

The club's involvement with the Illawarra Branch has been maintained on a satisfactory level, and the club has been well represented at Branch meetings, seminars, etc. arranged by the Branch. Club members continue to serve at Branch level with Bobo White as District Supervisor, and Graham Cook and Jeff Lucke joining Bobo and Con Asmussen on the Board of Examiners.

One of the biggest difficulties during the year has been finance, or rather the lack of it, despite some concerted efforts to overcome this. The main fund raising activities were Lifesavers Appeal Day, the Liverpool promotion and the Fun Run, whilst the largest item of expenditure was the repair of the surf boat.

The Junior Association has continued to report regularly to the Club Committee through their officers. Discussions took place during the year with the Junior Association officers about National Council plans for amalgamation of the Senior and Junior bodies.

Water safety has been provided as required by the Seagulis for their Sunday morning point scores, and for their club carnival and Junior Branch Championships.

Congratulations to the Seagulls on celebrating their 25th season.

Congratulations also to Evan Griffiths on his election as a Life Member of the Illawarra Branch of the Junior Surf Life Saving Association.

The financial statements for the 1983/84 year have been included in the following pages of this report. We are extremely grateful for a loan of \$1,000.00 made by the Seagulls to assist us in paying for the various items for the new building, pending receipt of advancements from the \$10,000.00 State Government Grant.

THE NEW CLUB HOUSE

During the past year, Wollongong City Council completed as much work as possible with the funds made available through a \$ for \$ Unemployment Relief Grant. At the time of Council's work being completed, the upstairs (hall) area has reached lock up stage and the club began to occupy and use this partly completed 'barn' from early in the season, particularly the radio/observation room. This in turn has allowed the Jack Mawson Memorial First Aid Room to revert to its intended use solely, as a first aid room.

The club was required to assist Council financially with the work carried out, and has paid \$4,000.00 from funds specially set aside in the Building Account, to Council.

Application was made to State Centre of the Australian early in 1984 for a Capital Assistance Grant from funds provided by the State Government. The club has been successful in obtaining a grant of \$10,000.00, and this is now being used towards fitting out the interior of the upstairs area.

Because of the value of materials to be purchased and the amount of labour involved, most of the \$10,000.00 grant will need to be spent on materials, thus leaving nearly all the labour to be undertaken by volunteer (club members) with technical assistance being provided by licensed tradesmen.

The club is extremely appreciative of the funds that have been provided by the State Government and Wollongong City Council, as well as our own members, to enable the new club house project to proceed.

SEAGULLS REPORT

Another season, 83/84 has now passed but this one being our 25th Anniversary year proved to be just as successful as other years and with another increase in membership now totalling in excess of 130 junior lifesavers. It has been a busy year, not only for the Juniors with their many success's at the various carnivals, but also for our club executive, Senior club members and the many parents who have all pitched in and given us their support.

During this Anniversary year we hosted a half day carnival and gained 2nd place which was a great effort for the 49 Junior lifesavers who competed. This carnival was not the only one well contested by our club.
